**VERDICT OF MANSLAUGHTER**

DIGBY, June 11—Harry Wilson is guilty of manslaughter, and the judge tells the jury that there was not a particle of evidence to show that murder was intended.

The June term of the supreme court opened here today. Mr. Justice Russell presiding. There is a large attendance of people from all over Digby county, there being much interest in the trial of Harry Wilson, who is charged with the murder of his brother George, during a drunken brawl at Harry's home on the 21st of September last, the day of the federal elections. At the September term of the supreme court Wilson was convicted and sentenced to die December 15th, but his lawyers appealed to the full bench of judges and a new trial was granted.

Guilty of manslaughter was the verdict of the jury. At four o'clock all the evidence had been heard and then followed the address of counsel for the prosecution and defense.

The judge's charge to the jury ended at four o'clock. Half an hour later the verdict was returned.

The judge practically told the jury that they could find the prisoner guilty of manslaughter only, as there was not a particle of evidence to show that Wilson intended to kill his brother, or that he even knew that he was loaded.

Wilson shook hands with the jury men, thanking them one and all. Sentence was deferred.

**KILLED BY SPIKE**

GLOUCESTER, Mass., June 11—Shoven against a picket fence by a drunken companion, Matthew Kangas 36 years old, a Finn, received injuries from which he died. An iron spike entered the right temple of Kangas, penetrating to the brain. Kangas was also under the influence of liquor. The accident occurred during a free fight.

This companion fled, but the injured man picked himself up and staggered to his boarding place, a short distance along Centennial street, and threw himself on a coach in the kitchen. Lighting a cigarette he described the affair to friends and then went unassisted to bed.

Medical Examiner: Quimby ascribed death to blood-clot on the brain resulting from a blow. Four men have already been arrested by the police, but it is said that the man who shoved Kangas against the fence is still at large.

**DOCTOR IS CONVICTED**

BAD AXE, Mich. June 11—Dr. Robert A. MacGregor, of Ualy, Mich., formerly of London, Ont., convicted of murder in the first degree in connection with the death of Seynol Sparling, was yesterday sentenced to life imprisonment in Jackson prison. Dr. MacGregor was found guilty of causing young Sparling's death by administering poison. Mrs. Carrie Bodie Sparling, the boy's mother, is soon to be tried on a similar charge.
