THE ALASKA BOUNDARY CONVENTION

Regarded in Great Britain as
Statesmanlike.

SIR. HIBBERT TUPPER M.P

Goldwin Smith and Commissioner
Congdon Give Varying Opinions
on the Subject.

NEW YORK, Jan. 30.—The correspondent of the New York Tribune in London cables:

"The Alaskan convention is regarded as a statesmanlike expedient, adopted in a neighbourly spirit of accommodation. With Dyea and Skagway included in the scope of the commission's enquiry, the entire controversy can be taken up in a reasonable and amicable way, without any feeling on either side that compulsion will be employed in the final settlement. Six men around a table will find out whether it is possible for Anglo-Saxons and good neighbors to agree upon a practical method of measuring ten marine leagues from the ocean, and the adoption of the problem to the physical conditions of the mainland, headlands and outlying archipelagos. Even if no decision can be reached in the absence of an arbitrator, no harm can come from the well ordered and friendly discussion:

MR. CONGDON INTERVIEWED.

Ottawa, Jan. 30.—Mr. Fred. Congdon the newly-appointed Commissioner of the Yukon, was yesterday asked by the Star correspondent his opinion of the Alaska boundary treaty. He said: "What can I say more than has already been said in the papers. The people of the Yukon will be very glad to see the boundary matter settled, but so convinced are they that Canada's claims are just that unless they are admitted to be correct the people in the Yukon will not be satisfied. The people of Skagway, too, would rather see Canada's claims allowed, for we can either make or lower their town. Of course the present commission will not settle the question, but the submission to them shows that the two powers are bent on trying to arrive at an amicable adjustment of the difficulty."

SIR. HIBBERT'S VIEW.

Toronto, January 30.—A Vancouver special to the Globe says that Sir Hibbert Tupper, speaking of the proposed Alaska Boundary Commission, said he believed that, as a usual, Canada was to be eulogized out of her rights. "I believe," added Sir Hibbert, "that England would never fight the United States for one inch of Canadian territory. The United States knows this, and knows what she is doing when she agrees to a commission of three on each side, for whichever way it goes the United States will win."

BY STANDEE'S REMARKS.

Toronto, January 30.—Professor Goldwin Smith, discussing the Alaskan Boundary Treaty, as By-Stander, in today's Sun, says:

When the Maine boundary question was under discussion in England, Brougham blurted out that he did not care where the boundary line was fixed so long as there was peace. All England, except, perhaps, Palmerton, was of the same mind. Nothing would induce the people of Great Britain to go to war with the United States for any object on this side of the Atlantic. This has been proved by the line of cases of diplomatic concession on the part of Great Britain which Canadian publicists deplore and of which the Venezuelan arbitration question is the most recent and not the least decisive. The British sword will never be drawn in any trans-Atlantic quarrel. What was most probable before is now rendered impossible by the development of the American war navy. In the way of negotiation the British Government has on every occasion done its very best, and every suspicion of indifference to sacrifice Canada to other diplomatic objects is and always has been totally unfounded and unjust. For recognition of our rights in any disputed question we must practically look to the equity of our powerful neighbours and to their regard for their international reputation, both of which motives happily have more influence with them than Canadian controversialists are apt to allow. The Department of State at Washington never was more disposed to cultivate the friendship of Great Britain than it is at present, and the terms to which it has consented, though they may fall short not only of our wishes, but of our strict rights, are probably the least disadvantageous to us that American sentiment would bear.

COFFIN BROKE OPEN.

CAIRO, Ill., February 1.—In a rear-end collision here between passenger trains on the Illinois Central, a private car, in which was the body of the late Judge Pentecost, chief counsel of the road, and members of the deceased's family, was partly wrecked. The coffin broke open.

RAILWAY MEETING AT CAPE WOLFE.

A large and enthusiastic meeting was held in Cape Wolfe Hall on Monday 26th inst for the purpose of discussing the proposed Branch Railway from the main line to Cape Wolfe. Beside the electors there were present Hon. Senator Yeo, Mr. Hackett M. P., A. McWilliams, M. L. A., Mr. Dennis of O'Leary and several others.

W. F. Blanchard was appointed chairman and the undersigned acted as Secy. P. J. Bolger explained the object of the meeting and the benefits to be derived from the proposed branch. Senator Yeo, expressed his approval of the project, and promised to do his utmost to bring it to a successful conclusion.

Mr. Hackett, M. P. stated that the Minister of Railways had promised to take the matter into consideration as soon as the Southern Railway is finished. He promised to bring the matter up at the next session of Parliament. Mr. McWilliams believed we would obtain the railway in the near future. He urged persistent agitation.

Mr. B. L. Cahill, teacher of Gleanzary being called upon by the chairman, made an eloquent speech in the course of which he urged the people to insist upon their rights and if the present government would not give them the railway to put in a Government who would. Mr. Cahill's address was practical and convincing and during its delivery he held the large audience spell bound. Several other speakers, having addressed the meeting, a petition asking for the railway was circulated, and signed. Votes of thanks were tendered Messrs. Yeo, Hackett, McWilliams, and the chairman. Mr. Blanchard after which the meeting dispersed.

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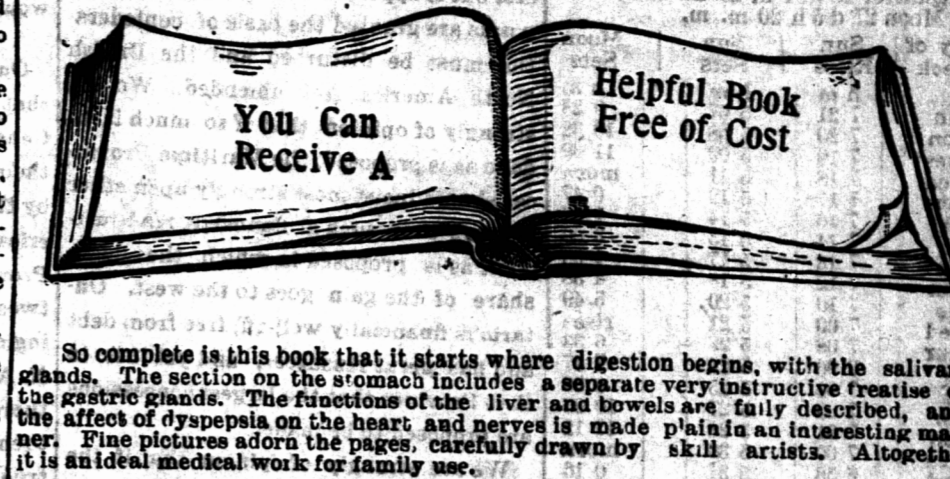
