Congratulations to Messrs. Sterling Matthews, Robert Campbell and Fred Campbell on the splendid new buildings they have almost completed.

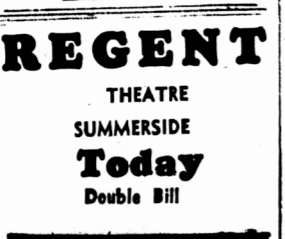

Fuel Situation In Halifax Serious

HALIFAX, Aug. 1.—(CP)—The domestic fuel situation in the Halifax area is more serious than at any time during the war, dealers reported today amid indications of a shortage of hard coal and furnace oil this winter.

One dealer predicted there would be no Welsh anthracite brought into Canada this winter, that coke would be short because it was going into the production of steel but that there would be plenty of soft coal. Soft coal is mined by 13,000 men in Nova Scotia.

The dealer added: "People aren't getting in their supply of coal the way they should. They don't seem to realize how serious the situation is. Deliveries were practically at a standstill from April 1 to July 15 though they have picked up recently."

Three companies dealing in oil furnaces have halted installation of further units because they cannot guarantee the supply of fuel for them.
