LOCAL BRIEFS

Latest News of the City and Province.

THERE will be a meeting to-night at 7 o'clock sharp in the First Methodist Church Parlor, to make final arrangements for the S. S. Picnic. A full attendance is requested.

THE market yesterday was well attended; the demand for dry butter was fair, 14c to 18c a lb being realized. The poultry market was poor, chickens bringing 45 to 50c a pair, and turkeys brought \$1.50 each. The first wild strawberries of the season were on the market. The fish market was largely attended and prices remained much as last day.

FIRST Methodist Church to-night, at 7.30 o'clock, the Rev. Dr. Carman will preach. After the ceremony refreshments were served and amid the customary old shoes and showers of rice, the happy couple left for Boston on the 8.33 train. The bride received a large number of hand-ome presents, showing the esteem in which she was held by her friends.
