EGG PRODUCTION PRICES - Egg production in this Province shows a further decline this week. It was learned yesterday.

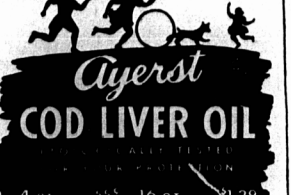
