POTATO TEST—Mr. T. G. Peppin, assistant plant pathologist at the Experimental Farm, leaves this morning for Long Island, N. Y. to attend the potato seed source test to be held there on the 29th and 30th instants. All the potato growing states of the union will be represented and samples of Green Mountains and Irish Cobbler from all of these states will be on exhibition and tested. There are seven samples entered from Prince Edward Island, the only Canadian province represented in the official test. Prince Edward Island is fortunate in having secured a place in this important exhibition as it means that it places the province on the seed-potato map. This boon for the province was secured through the continued efforts of Mr. Murphy, formerly Plant Pathologist at the Experimental Farm, efforts which have been ably continued by Mr. Peppin. The Guardian understands that the samples from this province are in good shape and the probability is that they will give a good account of Prince Edward Island's potato possibilities. It will be remembered that at the two last tests in Long Island, P. E. Island potatoes held the top notch in the tests, being freer from disease than any others shown.
