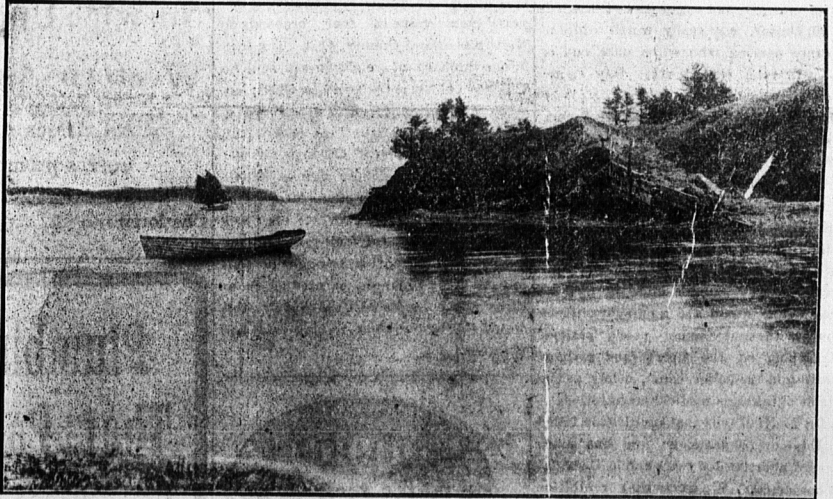
Walter Guinness being elected by nearly double the number of votes of his Liberal opponent. The election was fought out chiefly on the question of tariff reform.

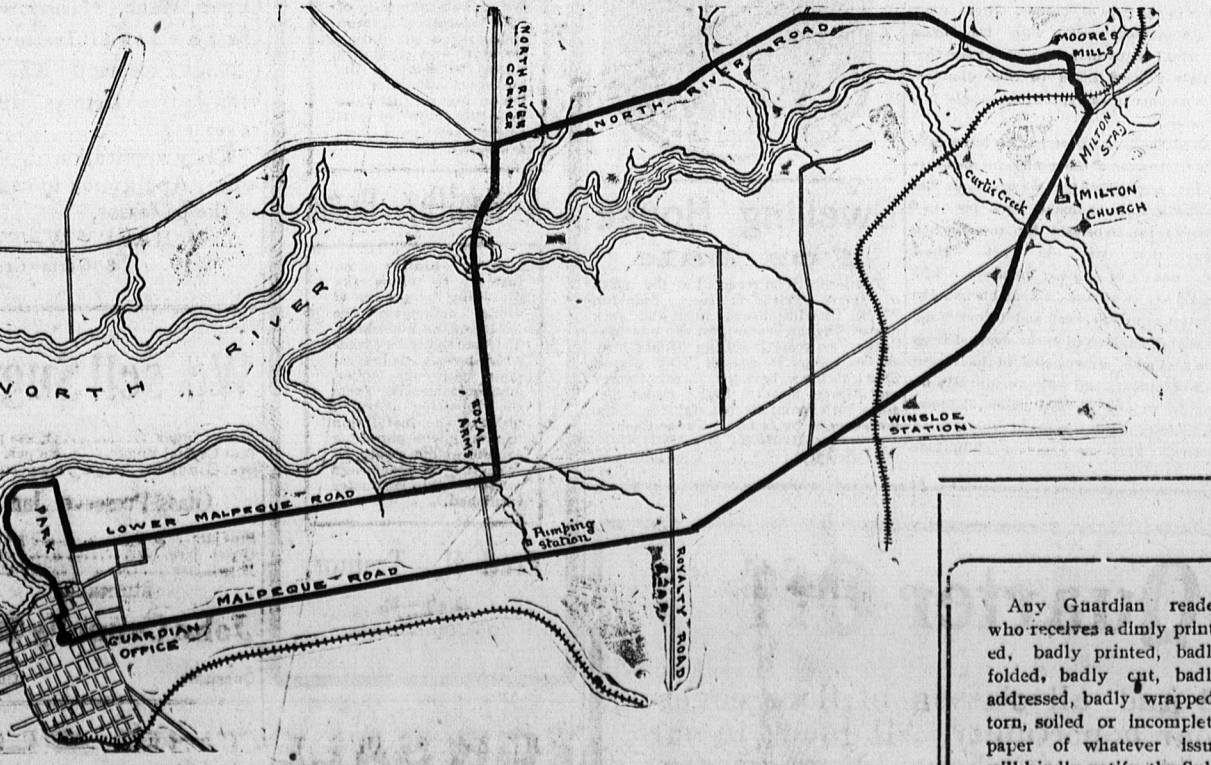
Sir Thomas Shaughnessy Receives Telegram From Japanese Consul at Ottawa Offering Congratulations.

Pacific Railway on the record breaking speed of the Empress of India, and the fact that the Japanese mails dated August 24, were received in Ottawa at three o'clock yesterday afternoon, making only fourteen days over a distance of seventy five hundred miles of sea and land.
