Gold Badge For Mackenzie King On Birthday

OTTAWA, Dec. 18—(C.P.)—The ex-service men of Canada contributed to the enjoyment of the 50th birthday of Rt. Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King, leader of the Liberal Party, when, in the presence of high executives of the Canadian Legion, Major John S. Roper, M.C., K.C., Dominion president, yesterday presented Mr. King with the gold badge and certificate of hon. life membership in that association. In so doing the legion consummated the formalities of admission to this restricted group of hon. life members which were initiated on July 23, 1930.

On that date Mr. King, as Prime Minister of Canada, became the first of that number and, at the same time Rt. Hon. R. B. Bennett, then leader of the Opposition, was also honored in this fashion by the Legion. Mr. Bennett received his credentials on Armistice Day, 1932, following the march past of the veterans on Parliament Hill.

Presenting Mr. King with the badge and certificate, Major Roper recalled the ceremony synchronized with the Liberal leader's 50th birthday, and in a way, partook of the character of a birthday gift. He tendered his congratulations to Mr. King, voicing the wish that he might have many years before him wherein to render service to his country.

STRESSES CAUSE OF CANADA'S STABILITY

MONTREAL, Dec. 18—(C. P.)—During the years of world depression Canada maintained her reputation of "delivering the goods according to the sample." Prime Minister R. B. Bennett told the members of the Dominion Commercial Travellers Association at their annual banquet here last night. Mr. Bennett spoke briefly taking as his subject the development of the country as a legal tender from the days of barter and tokens.

The Prime Minister paid tribute to the commercial travellers who, he said, had played an important part in maintaining the spirit of optimism and confidence through a period of economic uncertainty. If they had, at times, questioned the wisdom of being taken in Canada to cope with the problems of the day, he said, it indicated a healthy interest in public affairs. The address was non-political.

Mr. Bennett described the functions and need of a Central Bank in a country such as Canada which gravitated between fifth and sixth place in the world of trading nations, but did not enlarge upon this phase of the legislative program being prepared for the forthcoming session of Parliament.

Fully 95 per cent of the business of the country was now being carried on by the use of paper of no intrinsic value beyond the confidence of the recipient in the buyer's promise to pay, the Prime Minister said. As the reputation of an individual depended upon his reputation for redeeming his promises, so did the credit of a country depend upon the manner in which it fulfilled its contracts.

"It is a matter of pride to every Canadian and a source of tribute from the nations of the world that Canada has never become a defaulter in this respect," Mr. Bennett said. "The great danger in the use of paper money lies in the temptation to go on printing it to meet requirements, the Prime Minister said. The reason Canada enjoyed the reputation it had was because this country had placed a statutory limit upon the extent to which paper money could be issued.

Not In Accord With Nfld. Bill

MANCHESTER, England, Dec. 17—(C. P. Cable)—The Manchester Guardian, great Liberal organ, was distrustful Saturday of the British Government's Bill implementing recommendations of the Newfoundland Royal Commission by withdrawing self-government and making Britain responsible for three years in order to restore Newfoundland's finances.

"The public disquiet over the extraordinary provisions of the Newfoundland bill will not be allayed by the Government's attitude in the all-night sitting, said the Guardian in reference to Thursday's 17 hour debate in Committee.

"If we abolish self government in one of the Dominions, the most obvious safeguard is to insist on the fullest opportunities of supervision and publicity for the alternative government.

"Yet apparently, not the slightest record of the new commission's proceedings is to come before the British Parliament. The one concession the Secretary for Dominions would make was to agree that 'suspend' might be substituted after 'revoked' in the bill's reference to the constitution. The change of one single word will not make a bad bill into a good one."

Will Survey Ice Conditions In Canal Zones

MONTREAL, Dec. 18—(C. P.)—Major N. B. McLean, Chief Engineer of the St. Lawrence Ship Channel, will tomorrow survey ice conditions between Pointe aux Trembles and Malouine and report his observations to the Department of Marine at Ottawa.

On the basis of his report, it is understood, decision will be taken as to whether or not the icebreaker Mikula will attempt to force her way from Three Rivers to Montreal. The tug was caught by an ice jam in mid-river near Montreal last week when they vainly attempted to help the steamer Phoid on her way to Quebec. The steamer subsequently laid up here for the winter.

The Mikula and the icebreaker Lady Grey were working in the vicinity of Three Rivers over the week-end and docked there tonight.

Final Hearing Of Reichstag Fire Trial
