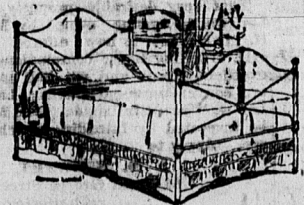

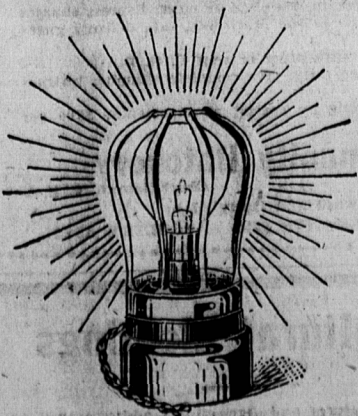

FREETOWN NOTES—The many friends of Miss Evelyn Burns, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Roy Burns, Lower Freetown, are sorry to learn that she is confined to her home with pneumonia. Her friends wish Evelyn a speedy recovery.—Miss Maria Stavert, R. N., of North Bedeque, is in Freetown on professional duties.—Mr. David Condon, Summerside, is visiting in South Freetown, the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Eidon Drummond.—Mr. Stanley Biggar, Stanley Bridge, spent Sunday in South Freetown.—Mr. Ralph Burns has returned to the United States after spending the winter with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Burns.—Mr. A. C. Gardiner was to Moncton, N. B., on business last week.—Mr. Russell Burns and Mr. Joseph Clow were visitors to Summerside on Thursday.—There is no scarcity of horses in Freetown at present. YUKON PIONEER—Mr. Daniel McFadyen of Bonshaw, an old timer of the West and Alaska in the "wild and woolly" days, spent the week end at Kensington, the guest of Mr. W. B. McArthur. Mr. McFadyen also visited some of his "Yukon Tellitums" who now reside near Kensington. He has been an extensive traveller in the Western Hemisphere, and had the aptitude, (or rather the privilege) of being in the close vicinity when some famous events were happening. He was in the Northwest during the last Red Rebellion, also in Minnesota when the James boys and the Younkers made their last bank hold up in a small Minnesota town. His description of the "stick up" is most graphic. He was also in Shagway, Alaska when the notorious crook "Soapy" Smith, (Mayor of Skagway) was shot dead by Reid, who was shot instantly by Smith at the same instant. In the fall of 1897, McFadyen with eleven others from Lynn, Mass. outfitted a vessel at Freeport, N. S., and sailed through the Straits of Magellan en route to the Klondike gold fields. As quite often happens on expeditions of the kind, strife and contention amounting to mutiny, arose aboard. When the Argonauts reached Frisco they held a council and agreed to sell the ship and divide the sum realized. Mr. McFadyen then proceeded to the gold fields and later on prospected and explored on the Kuskokwim Kautishna, Tanana, Tolavana, Shushana and Iditarox practically all the river systems of that extensive territory. On account of his vast store of knowledge and actual experience, Mr. McFadyen is a most interesting conversationalist—not to mention his natural vivacity and observance of the social amenities.—K.
