Each and everyone then is suitable soil for the development of Tuberculosis.

Why then does approximately only one in eleven die of Tuberculosis? Because—The disease Tuberculosis is dependent upon the amount of germs entering the body and the resistance of the individual. One can readily see that an enormous number of germs entering the body are more capable of producing disease.

As to resistance we mean the ability of the body to overcome and kill the tuberculosis germs. This resistance is dependent upon living conditions as to crowding, fresh air and sunshine, the question of proper and sufficient food and finally the lowering of one's strength by other diseases.

Ordinarily the more healthy the individual is physically the better food he receives, the more out-door living indulged in, the less mental worry and strain, and the fewer diseases (other than tuberculosis) that he has, seem to protect him from a breakdown of tuberculosis.

Just what this matter of resistance consists of we are at present unable to state, except that it has probably something to do with the acquired fighting power of each individual cell.

SAUNDERS AND INCREASED TAXES

Sir,—One of your correspondents makes very clear a result of the policy proclaimed by Mr. Saunders, which is calculated to make every taxpayer in the Province think. He shows that if the promises of the Leader of the Opposition should be fulfilled the people will "surely get a big dose of taxes." If the forty thousand dollars a year received from the C. N. R. should be handed over to the towns, and the proceeds of the sale of liquors by the vendors used wholly for the enforcement of the Prohibitory Liquor Act, the revenue of the government of the Province will be reduced by about a hundred thousand dollars a year. That is considerably more than a dollar for every man, woman, and child—an average of more than five dollars a year for every farmer and householder.

More than that there is the Old Age Pension Bill which Mr. Saunders has stated that he is in favor. That measure will help the old people of Canada but it will necessitate an additional draught upon the Provincial revenue of about \$100,000 per annum. According to the bill, each province has to supply half the amount required. Old age pensions will consequently and certainly involve a heavy additional burden upon all those who have to pay taxes. If Mr. Saunders and his party should, unfortunately get into power, and other means of exacting additional taxes of \$10 per family per annum.
