Establish New Customs District

HALIFAX, Dec. 20 — The Province of New Brunswick, with the exception of four counties, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland and the Magdalen Islands, have been established as Customs and Excise Inspection District No. 1 with R. W. Thornton, Saint John, in charge as district inspector.

Mr. Thornton replaces Inspector R. H. Pope of Halifax, who retired from office in October of this year.

It is expected that the other areas, including Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, will be included in another district which will be organized shortly.

Confirmation of Mr. Thornton's appointment was received from the Revenue Department yesterday. His headquarters now are in Saint John, but eventually may be moved to Moncton.

Under previous arrangement there was an inspector in Halifax who was in charge of the Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island inspection districts.
