EXTRAVAGANCE CRY PETERS OUT

(Continued from Page One.)

expenditure on public works and compared it with what the Liberals had spent. Did he seek to compare the results? No, he took good care not to tell the House, and the people throughout the country that the present Government had done four times as much in four years as the Liberals had done in 21 years. It was results that the people looked for and he could tell the members of the Opposition that the people in the country were satisfied with what the Government had done for the improvement of public works. In his own district, in the Cardigan district, and even in Mr. Bell's district the people were thoroughly satisfied with the money expended on public works. Why was it that these gentlemen came there and made such noise about the expenditure on public works. He had been reading the report of the House in the old days, twenty-four years ago, when Mr. Bell was just a member, and when he sat on the Government side. He made a speech, and told a story which he thought was equally applicable to the Opposition of to-day. Mr. Bell had said the then critics of the Government put him in mind of an old Scottish preacher who gave as his text the words: "The devil goes about like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour," and he divided his sermon into three parts under three heads, "Who the devil he is," "where the devil he's going," and "what the devil he's roaring at." Now he would point the moral and adorn the tale by asking the Leader of the Opposition "where the devil he's roaring at?" (Loud laughter in which

Mr. Bell heartily joined.) For the 21 years they were in power the Liberals had only 14 steel bridges to their credit costing \$38,000, whereas in three years the present Government had erected 20 steel bridges at a cost of \$138,000. Was that not something to boast about? The people appreciated the great improvement in their public works and visitors to the province had remarked upon the magnificent structures the government had erected all over the country. He could tell them from his own experience that the people were satisfied with the way public works were managed. In his own district they were represented for twenty-two years by Liberals and their roads and bridges went from bad to worse, and nothing was done for them. Since the present Government came into power the roads had been improved 100 per cent, and they had erected seven new steel bridges which would stand as a monument to the Government which gave as his text the words: "The devil goes about like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour." The member for Cardigan, Mr. Johnston, had attempted to create trouble in that House at the very beginning of the session by interrupting him in his remarks. The hon. member was not in his seat, but if he were he would tell him now as he had told him then that he (Mr. Kennedy) never made statements he was not prepared to back, and he was prepared to say so again.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency or Sub Agency on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section on along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, or certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after cultivating 50 acres and erect a house worth \$5.00. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

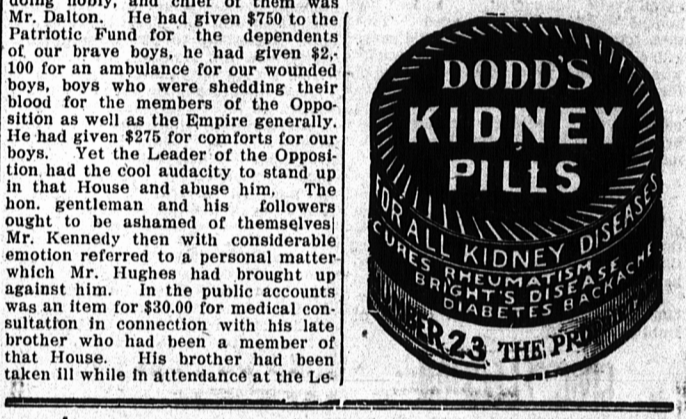
