**Favorites Make Headway in Stock Market**

(By Victor Eubank, Associated Press Financial Writer)  
NEW YORK, Oct. 26—(AP)—A smattering of favorites continued to make headway in today's stock market while many leaders dozed in lower territory.  
The Associated Press 80-stock composite was off 4 of a point at 62.3.  
Weakness prevailed in the Canadian group. C. P. R. and Hiram Walker each lost 1-2 and Dis-Willers Seagram slipped 3-4. Lake Shore on the curb was off 1-4.  
Pfizer pushed up 2 1-2 points to 60 7-8. Douglas Aircraft added a point at one time but finished unchanged at 78. Kennecott was ahead 1 at 46 1-2. U. S. Steel 1-2 at 71 and Texas Co 1-2 at 59 1-2.  
Holding fractional improvement were Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, Republic Steel, Sears Roebuck, Western Union "A", Union Carbide, International Nickel and Phelps Dodge.  
Among casualties Johns-Manville yielded 4 1-2 at 122 1-2. C. I. T. Finance 1 5-8 at 38 3-8. Du Pont 3 3-4 at 172. Dow Chemical 2 5-8 at 160 5-8. Eastman Kodak 1 3-4 at 205 1-4 and American Telephone 1 3-8 at 171 1-2.  
Others on the outside were General Motors, Goodyear, Goodrich, Montgomery Ward, Woolworth, International Harvester, Caterpillar Tractor, Boeing, Electric Power and Light, Anaconda, American Smelting, General Electric (on a disappointing earnings compilation), Philip Morris, Standard Oil (N.J.), Santa Fe, Southern Pacific, Southern Railway, Northern Electric and Chesapeake and Ohio.
