"Open" and "Weak Bodied" Cheese.

Description.—"Finest" cheese must have a close solid body. The presence of numerous, irregular holes makes what is known as "open" cheese. "Weak bodied" cheese are of the same character with some excess of moisture.

Cause.—Openness in cheese is usually the result of an insufficient development of acidity in the curd before salting and putting to press. An open, loose body is sometimes caused by lack of sufficient pressing. Some curds will not make close, solid cheese under any amount of pressure, yet on the other hand no cheese is ever so close as it might be unless heavy pressure has been gradually and persistently applied.

Remedy.—This defect may be overcome by allowing more acid to develop in the curd before salting; that is to say more time should be allowed from the drawing of the whey until the curd is salted and put to press. The less acid there is in the curd when the whey is drawn the longer will be the time required to mature it properly.

Supreme Court.

Samuel Cousins vs William A. Jardine.—This case was concluded yesterday evening. The forenoon was occupied in hearing evidence, and in the afternoon the Attorney General addressed the jury on behalf of the defendant and Mr. Stewart, K. C. for the plaintiff. The jury after the judge charged them, retired and in about an hour's time returned with a verdict for the plaintiff for \$100 damages.
