Consultation, Coordination, Cooperation

At a recent City Council meeting it was explained by Finance Chairman Chandler that the Joint Committee of the new Tax Adjustment Board was set up by Order-in-Council of the Provincial Government and that the Board would act only within the limits prescribed therein. Following is the text of the Order-in-Council referred to:

WHEREAS the external audit recently instituted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown has established all arrears of City taxes as the same appear on the books and records of the said City;

AND WHEREAS other factors appearing in the report of such audit suggest the possibility of errors or improprieties existing in such records and of taxpayers having been precluded thereby from their rightful and timely appeal;

AND WHEREBY the said City Council is desirous of affording to all taxpayers in arrears, who claim to have been prejudiced by such errors or improprieties or in result thereof, a right of appeal for review and adjustment of arrears, and of having the arrears of all taxpayers not claiming and found to be so prejudiced confirmed as established by such audit;

THEREFORE the Lieutenant-Governor in Council did HEREBY ORDER AND ALLOW as follows:

1. The City of Charlottetown is hereby authorized and empowered to constitute by resolution of the City as its special Board of Commissioners of Review and Appeal, to be composed of a Chairman and two other persons, all by such resolution named, and appointed to be approved by this Council to hear and determine all objections to tax arrears as hereinafter provided.

2. The said Board shall be remunerated by said City for its services as such resolution or any other resolution of said Council shall provide or determine.

3. The said Board shall convene and sit by order of its Chairman at such times and place within the City as it shall determine, to be notified to the public as to the first occasion at least one week prior thereto by newspaper publication or as the Chairman shall determine, and thereafter by adjournment from time to time, and shall there and then hear and examine all objections by any and all taxpayers attending in person or by agent, and the said Board shall rear appearing on the books of the City as owing by the objecting taxpayer as on the fifteenth day of January, 1939, and there shall receive evidence under oath or by affidavit, and therefor shall administer oath by the Chairman or by any clerk by the Board appointed.

4. Should it be made to appear to the Board that any taxes or assessments, or part thereof, carried forward in arrears had in fact been paid, then the Board shall allow therefor and reduce or cancel the amount of arrears accordingly.

5. Should it be made to appear to the Board that any assessment carried forward into such arrears had been made in respect of non-existent or non-taxable property and that such assessment had been so dealt with by any agent of the City so as to induce the taxpayer to fail to enter timely appeal therefrom, then the Board shall strike off said assessment and reduce or cancel the amount of arrears accordingly.

6. Should it appear to the Board that any part of such arrears is comprised of improper reduction of valuation made by any agent of the City and that such reduction has induced the taxpayer to fail to enter timely appeal, then the Board shall grant leave to such taxpayer to have all appeals therefrom by him heard forthwith by the regular Board of Appeal from Civic Rates and Assessments, and the said regular Board shall forthwith hear the said appeal and report its findings thereon to the Board hereby constituted, and the latter Board shall thereby reduce or confirm the said assessment and the amount of arrears.

7. The Board hereby constituted shall, after hearing and determining all matters of objection to it presented, make one general order confirming all arrears of taxes shown by the records of the said City as owing at January 15th, 1939, subject only to such reductions as it shall have allowed as aforesaid.

8. No person shall suffer any franchise or electoral disqualification if he shall have paid within the period required by statute any amount in respect of his arrears which shall have been reduced by the Board hereby constituted, any records of the City to the contrary notwithstanding.

9. The Board hereby constituted shall fulfill its duties and make all orders required of it before the thirty-first day of December, 1939.

I. O. D. E. Awards To Be Made

CANDIDATES SELECTED IN NOVEMBER

Selection of candidates for the post-graduate scholarship for study in any university in the United Kingdom, one of which is offered in each of the nine Provinces annually by the Imperial Order of the Empire will take place during November. It is announced that these scholarships, which have been awarded annually from the I. O. D. E. War Memorial established after the Great War, are of the value of \$1,400 a year. In awarding the scholarship the committee of selection in each province, will consider academic attainments and promise, and also personal character and physical fitness. Other conditions being equal, preference will be given to a returned soldier's sister, brother, son or daughter. The candidate selected this November must be prepared to begin his or her course in Great Britain in the autumn of 1940. Certain certificates are required of applicants and must be furnished not later than October 15, 1939.

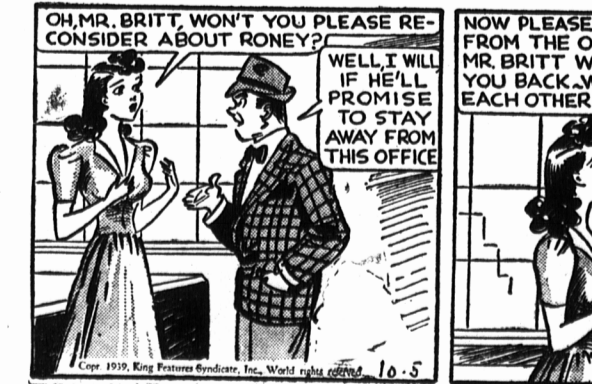

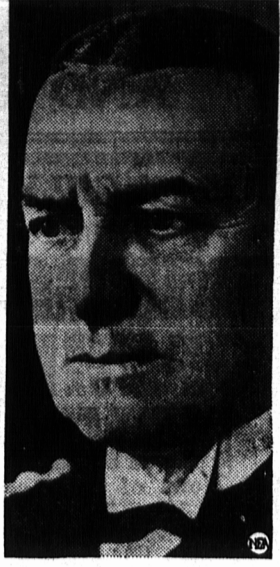
