Selected Industrials Firm At Montreal
 MONTREAL, Jan. 7 (CP)—Selected industrial issues displayed firming tendencies in late afternoon trading following irregularity during most of the session on the stock exchange and curb market today. Trading improved but the list narrowed. Price changes were mainly fractional. Mines recovered partially from yesterday's losses in a moderately active market.
 Closing averages indicated banks up .05 at 27.75; utilities up 2 at 73.6; industrials up 2 at 121.7; papers up 2 at 36.01; golds up 35 at 74.80. Approximate industrial sales were 36,400 shares and mining sales totaled 172,800 shares, an increase of 71,000 shares over yesterday's sales.
 Montreal Paper was up 1-2 at 58 in papers. B. C. Forest, on a turnover of 2,900 shares advanced 1-8 at 4. Abitibi and Consolidated Paper added 1-8 each at 16 3/4 and 18 7/8, respectively. Brown dropped 1-4 at 5 1/4.
 Imperial Oil reached a new high of 15 3/4 after a gain of 3-4 on a turnover of 3,780 shares. International Petroleum was ahead a similar amount at 15 1/4. On a turnover of 2,640 shares, McColl was up 3-8 at 13 1/8. Home Oil went up 10 cents at 8.25 and Consolidated Homestead was one cent better at 75 cents turnover of 11,500 shares. Okalla, on a turnover of 1,500 shares dropped 12 cents at 1.12.
 Noranda led metal gainers by advancing 1-2 cents at 61. Consolidated Smelting was 1-2 better at 97 1/2 and International Nickel, on a turnover of 1,400 shares, was up 1-4 at 33 3/4. Bell gainer 1-4 at 168 1/4 in utilities and Shawinigan added 1-8 at 21 5/8.
 Other industrial gainers were Dosco "B" up 1-2 at 18, and Massey-Harris, ahead 1-4 at 18 1/2 on a turnover of 1,534 shares.
 In metals, Labrador, on a turnover of 1450 shares, gained 30 cents at 7.56. East Sullivan was up a similar amount at 3.40. On a turnover of 41,700 shares, Quebec Man-ganes went ahead three eighths. Bank-ore dropped one cent.
 Trading box score: Stocks traded 170; higher 62; lower 53; unchanged 64; new highs 5; new lows 9.

 Another holiday season market brought a lightening of livestock, and prices were strong with cattle 26 cents to 50 cents higher and in some cases 75 cents up. Calves advanced as much as \$1.00. Bank-ore dropped one cent.

Western Cattle Markets
 Receipts of live eastern cattle markets were light and Toronto advanced 25 cents to 50 cents with heavy steers selling between \$14 and a high of \$17 and butcher steers between \$12 and \$14. Some of the receipts at Montreal consisted of cows and heifers, selling about 25 cents higher than in the previous clip. Highest price paid for steers was \$15.50 and for cows \$10.50 to \$11.50. In the Maritimes steers and heifers were quoted at \$9 to \$12.50 with top quality \$10 f. o. b. country points.

Export to United States
 Export shipments of dairy cattle to the United States for the week were 681 head compared with 904 in the corresponding week last year. Reports for the year total 55,474 as against 68,996 in 1946.

Higher Calf Prices
 Calves were firm sellers at all markets with Toronto selling the pace at an advance of \$1.00. Choice veals at Toronto were mostly \$18 to \$19, with a few \$20; while Montreal veals ranged to a top of \$21. Winnipeg sold best veals up to \$18; Edmonton \$12.50 to \$15.50 and an odd \$14; Saskatoon up to \$16; and Vancouver \$15 to \$16.

Hogs Higher in East; Steady in West
 Hog prices made gains on eastern markets, with Toronto advancing 75 cents to \$24.00 for Grade A and Montreal paying \$24.50 to \$24.75. Winnipeg held \$20.95 for Grade A; Calgary \$22 to \$22.10; Edmonton \$21.50; Prince Albert and Saskatoon \$21.50; and Vancouver \$22.
