Leonardo Barillas, in the streets of Mexico City, and the trial of his murderers now in progress in that city unfolds another page in the bloody history of a Central American ruler, who, if all accounts are true, may well be termed the Nero of modern times.

RECOGNIZED AS A TERRORIST
