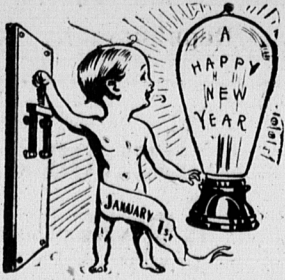

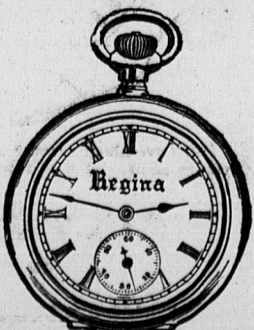
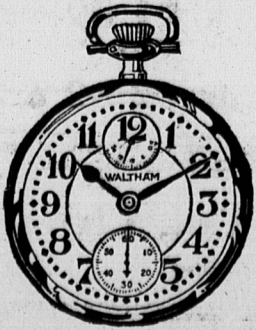

RETRAINING COURSES.—Professor F. H. Sexton, vocational officer for Quebec and the Maritime Provinces, under the department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment; R. Murray, Re-education member of the Industrial Training Centre, Halifax, and Major W. Maxwell, Assistant District Vocational Officer for B. Unit, are now in Charlottetown inspecting the work done in connection with the retraining courses for disabled men and minors, in the Lena McLean Memorial Hospital. They have orders to occupy that part of the Hospital which they are now using temporarily until an adjustment is made or other quarters secured, 400 men are training on the island and about 60 are in the hospital. The vocational department is using one floor of the main building and the two outside buildings owned by the provincial government which the department have altered for vocational purposes. All the machinery is installed and the work going on in excellent shape. Colonel Hayes, NUN, Medical Director of B. Unit, Captain F. A. Ladd, Assistant Director of the Unit, are coming over to see about the disposal of the Hospital.

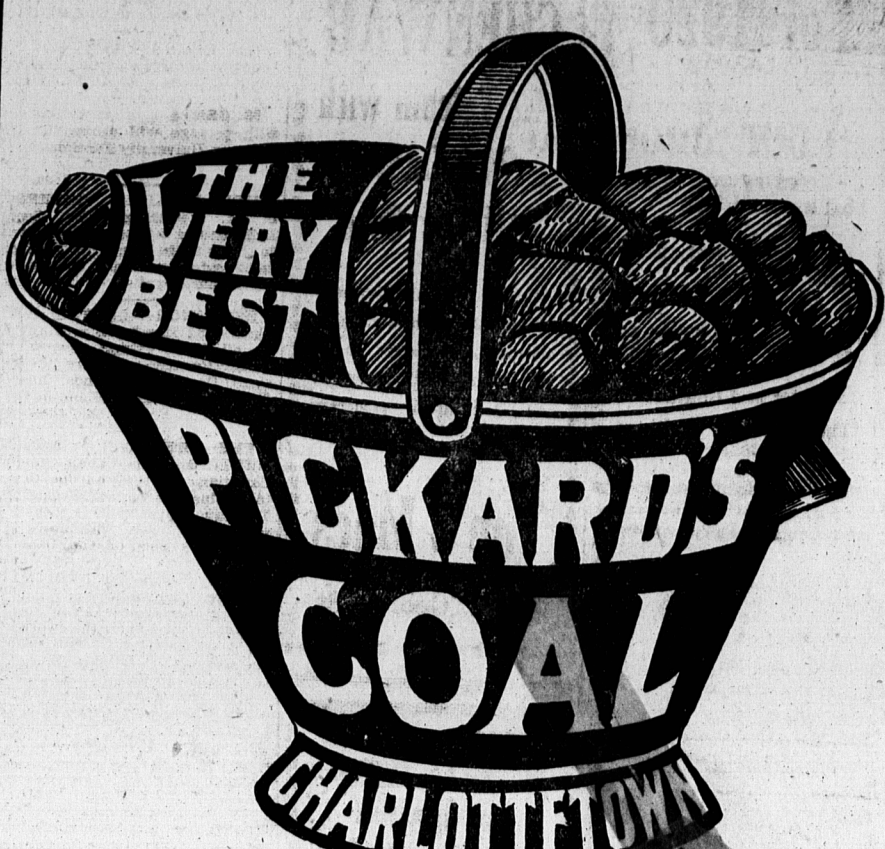
Mr. Thomas Trainor, Peakes Station was in the city yesterday

Grafting Glands From Chimpanzees

PARIS, Feb. 26.—The public should not be misled by the assertions of the British press that professors of Oxford have discovered the elixir of life. The only novelty is that a synthetic substitute for the thyroid extract has been found. Any physician knows the function of the thyroid secretion, which is not rejuvenation, but the development of the body to its full growth. That tadpoles have developed into toads in three weeks instead of three months shows that they were helped towards a result which is the inverse of rejuvenation. The discovery of a synthetic thyroid extract is interesting because it will facilitate the administration of the secretion to children born without these glands, just as adrenalin, which is a synthetic extract of the suprarenal glands is now freely used when necessary. The public, however, should be warned against use of thyroid cure for normal man, because since the thyroid, issuing just enough of the extract, the absorption of an extra quantity would be extremely pernicious. The results announced concerning birth control, giving ninety per cent of the men offspring, through the thyroid cure also is interesting because it reversed the well-known theory that rich food results in an increase of female birth, while poor nutrition favors male births. Italy, a sober frugal nation, has a surplus of men, while England, where meat and rich foods are the usual diet, has more women. Rejuvenation, both physical and mental, can be acquired only through the interstitial gland because it is the function of such glands to supply vigor. My experiments in the grafting of interstitial glands on animals have been brought to a successful conclusion and the results have been tabulated. Next Fall I expect to be able to announce the results of similar experiments on men, thirty of whom are now awaiting the arrival from Africa of a lot of chimpanzees from which the grafting glands are to be taken. All will have recovered perfectly from the operations and many should have positive results by the end of the Summer.

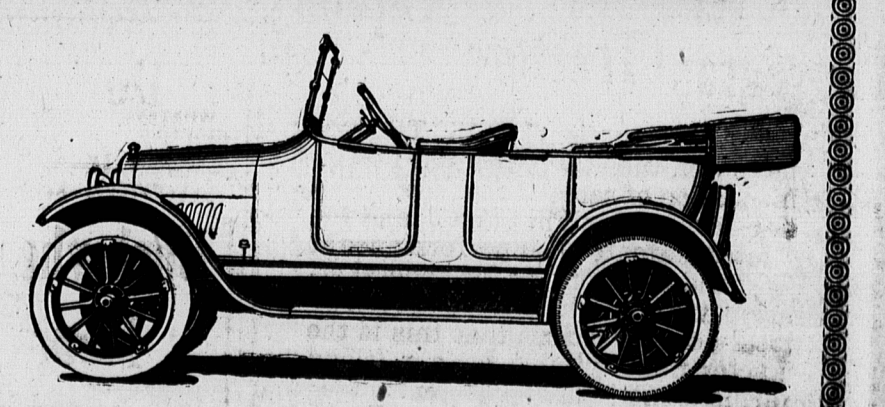
