War Insurance Scheme Proposed

(By J. F. SANDERSON (Canadian Press Staff Writer)) LONDON, Feb. 2.—(CP Cable)—The British government is preparing to embark on the biggest war risk insurance scheme ever devised in which civilian and front line soldiers are placed on equal terms.

When war seemed to be only a matter of hours in September many people discovered to their dismay that they could not insure their property against war risks. The scheme has been taken two years before by the big insurance companies, who are watching the lessons of the Spanish war.

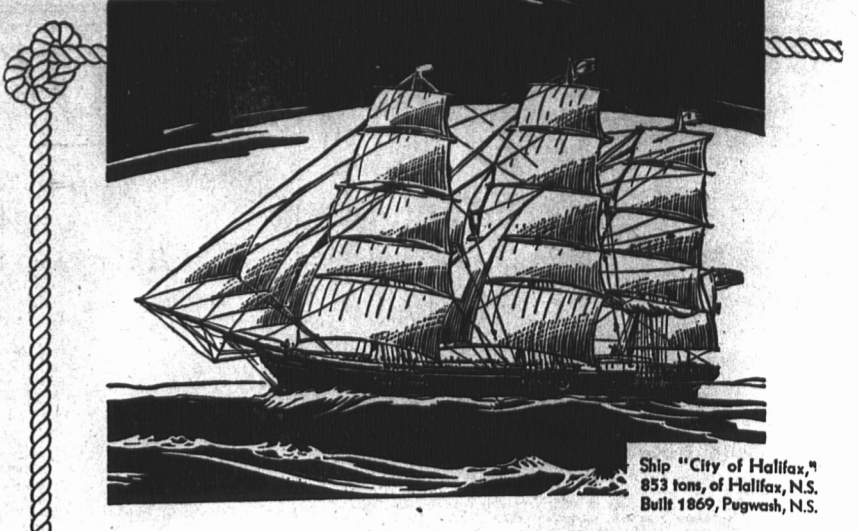
