## German Oil Plants Bombed Out Of Existence

Key Nazi Armament Factories Scenes Of Devastation — R. A. F. Does Great Damage.

LONDON, Oct. 27.—(CP)—In a lengthy report of Royal Air Force operations over Berlin since the beginning of September, the Air Ministry tonight told of widespread damage in the German capital and of scenes of devastation in key armament factories in the Reich.

LONDON, Oct. 28.—(Monday)—(CP)—Axis warplanes dropped tons of explosives and fire bombs in opening their 51st night attack on the capital last night but early today comparative calm had settled over the darkened capital.

## Report Fascist Troops Advance At Zero Hour

Hour Has Come To Fight For Honor Greeks Told By Premier.

ATHENS, Oct. 28.—(AP)—King George II announced today Greece had been "compelled to go to war against an Italy coveting Greece's independence" shortly after Premier John Metaxas rejected an Italian ultimatum for surrender of part of her territory.

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, Oct. 28.—(AP)—Italy was reported to have attacked Greece by land, sea, and air, hurling at least 10 divisions of 200,000 Italian troops across the Greek-Albanian frontier.

ATHENS, Oct. 28.—(Monday)—(AP)—Rejecting an Italian ultimatum calling for surrender by Greece of part of her territory, Premier John Metaxas declared today "the moment has arrived for Greece to fight for her independence and honor."

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, Oct. 28.—(Monday)—(AP)—Greek Minister Roetti declared today that a state of war exists between Italy and Greece and fighting started at 6 a. m. (midnight EDT Sunday).

Italy started to build a case for invasion two months ago when Rome claimed an Albanian "patriot" had been killed by Greeks. Athens, after an investigation, declared the "patriot" was an Albanian bandit who was slain inside Greece.

## 13 New Cases Of Diphtheria In Halifax

HALIFAX, Oct. 27.—(CP)—Thirteen new cases of diphtheria were reported in Halifax over the week-end following Saturday's first clinic plans to set up more immunization centres with a view to averting an epidemic of major proportions.

## Shovel Snow To Harvest Crops In N. B.

FREDERICTON, Oct. 27.—(CP)—The unusual sight of farmers shovelling snow from their fields in order to harvest root crops was frequent in Central New Brunswick today following Saturday's first six-inch snowfall. A fairly large percentage of root crops is still in the ground.

## Evacuee's Note Picked Up By P.E.I. Fisherman

QUEBEC, Oct. 27.—(CP)—A note placed in a bottle and cast into the ocean by nine-year-old Margaret Pinto while on her way to Canada last August with other evacuated British children, has reached her father in London, it was learned yesterday.

## Censors Take Mail From U. S. Clipper

HAMILTON, Bermuda, Oct. 27.—(CP Cable)—Pan-American Airways Atlantic Clipper arrived from the Azores on her trans-Atlantic flight today with 713 pounds of mail aboard and British censors took 479 pounds of it off the ship for inspection.
