## Helpful Hints For The Women Folk

### BE A FRIEND

Be a friend! You don't need money. Just a disposition sunny; just a wish to help another. Get along somehow or other. Just a kindly hand extended. To the one who's unburdened; just the will to give or lend—this will make you some one's friend.

When stocking the bathroom linen closet, select heavy towels with a strong basic weave and firm selvage for long wear, and long, loosely-twisted loops for greatest absorbency. A dozen each of bath towels, face cloths and linen hand towels, and four bath mats is a stock for a family of two—and extras, of course for guests.

To provide extra closet space in the dining room, a corner cupboard is just the thing. Paint the outside to match the woodwork and if a little color would brighten or add smartness, the inside surfaces might be done in a contrasting shade.

Use lukewarm water and a mild suds when washing white silk and do not dry in direct sunshine. Since silk scorches easily, use only a warm iron to press. Dampen the garment all over evenly, taking care not to have it too wet. Press on the wrong side under thin press cloth.

### MIDDY BLOUSE STAGES REVIVAL IN ENGLAND

London—Guess who's back again? The old middy blouse. Remember? Not since the early 1900's, when American women brought this fashion to England, has anything like a middy been worn here. The new middy is cut straight and worn over a skirt without a bra. The square sailor collars are braided.

**CLEAN COFFEE MAKERS**  
Delicious fragrant coffee was

never made in a coffee pot that was not absolutely clean. The least bit of sediment from previous coffee making will spoil the flavor of the fresh brew. Wash the coffee maker after each using in hot soap suds, using a small brush to scrub out the spout. Rinse and scald with boiling water. Once a week fill it with cold water to which a tablespoon of soda has been added and bring to a boil. Then wash as usual with soap and water, rinse thoroughly and dry. Electric coffee makers should, of course, never be immersed in water.

Don't discard the large leaves of cauliflower. Boil for about 20 minutes and serve with plenty of butter, salt and pepper.

**EGG ECONOMY**  
Here is a good substitute for egg whites for macarons and meringues. Dissolve 1 tablespoonful of powdered gelatin in 2 tablespoonfuls of hot (not boiling) water. Stir till completely dissolved, then leave till cold. Use this in just the same way as you would the whites of eggs. Incidentally, being made this way does not crack when dry but sets with a good gloss.

### YIFTS SPIRITS

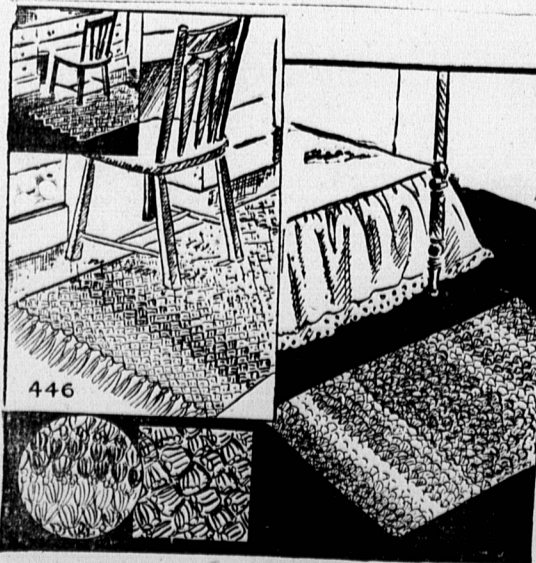

### DRYING BLANKETS QUICKLY

To dry blankets quickly, hang over two parallel lines so that the air can circulate freely between the folds. Stretching or sagging can be avoided if the weight is evenly divided. Woolen blankets should never be exposed to direct sunshine, extreme heat or cold. Dry slowly at a moderate temperature is a good rule for drying all woolen materials.

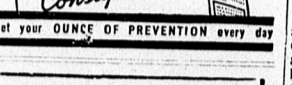

## THE COOK'S CORNER

### LEMON CHIFON PIE

1-2 cup lemon juice  
Grated rind 1 lemon  
1 cup sugar  
1-4 teaspoon salt  
3 eggs, separated  
1 tablespoon gelatin  
1-4 cup cold water  
Baked pie shell

Method: Combine lemon juice and rind, 3-4 cup of the sugar, the salt, and egg yolks which have been beaten. Cook over hot water until the mixture is thickening. Sprinkle the gelatin over the cold water and let stand for 5 minutes. Add the soaked gelatin to the hot egg mixture and stir until the gelatin is dissolved.

Beat the egg whites until stiff and fold in the remaining 1-4 cup of sugar. Fold this into the cooled egg mixture. Pour into a baked pie shell and chill in the refrigerator until set. Cover the top with whipped cream that has been sweetened, or sprinkle the top with a mixture of walnuts, cracker crumbs and chopped nuts.

### PINEAPPLE CHIFON PIE

1-2 cup sugar  
1-2 teaspoon salt  
4 tablepoons cornstarch  
3 egg whites  
1-4 cup sugar  
1-4 cup sugar (additional)  
1 tablespoon lemon juice

Method: Combine the crushed pineapple and syrup in a can, 1-2 cup sugar and salt. Heat over direct heat to the boiling point, add the cornstarch which has been dissolved in the 1-4 cup cold water. Cook the mixture until it is thick and clear, then remove from the fire.

Mix the egg whites and 1-4 cup sugar and beat until very dry and stiff, then gradually add the other 1-4 cup sugar and continue beating until the last sugar has been thoroughly dissolved.

Fold the pineapple mixture, that is still warm, gently into the egg white mixture and add the lemon juice. Bake in a baked pie shell and chill in the refrigerator until set and cold. A whipped cream topping may be added if desired.

The way to stay happily married is to follow the Golden Rule. Treat your wife or husband the way you would like for her or him to treat you.

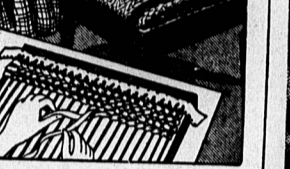

**Cheery Footstool Cover You Will Enjoy Weaving**



**You Can Make a Loom Yourself!**  
Quaint and cheery is this rag footstool cover which you can easily weave for yourself on a simple home-made loom.

Use odds and ends of cloth in soft old-fashioned colors—greens, pinks and blues—and for your loom nail together four wooden slats, making an oblong frame.

Now to the frame's longer sides tack burlap strips and through these strips thread the warp, twisting, carrying it back and forth across loom to form a warp.

For the weft, cut cloth in strips three or four inches wide and fold raw edges over, making strips about one inch wide. Double your first strip, start at upper left of loom and weave with both ends. One end goes over warp, while the other passes under, as the diagram shows. As you weave, push rows together, forming a pretty braided pattern.

**REMOVING SPOTS**  
A good rug deserves all the care means taking out a spot as soon as it appears.  
Food and grease stains are the most places attacked by moths. Usually they can be taken out with a mild soap and water, rinsing the soap out thoroughly.  
Blood stains are best removed with clear, cold water, no soap. Don't saturate the rug; just drip water on with an eye dropper, work into the pile with a clean rag, then blot with a blotter or sponge.  
Remove ink by first blotting up all wet ink possible. Then drip lukewarm water on the spot with

an eye dropper, working into the pile and blotting as you work, taking care not to rub. When the blotter shows no more ink, that it probably all the ink you can get out. If stain remains you'll have to get rug cleaned.  
Fruit and alcohol stains are best removed with clear water applied at once.  
Chewing gum can be removed with gasoline and paint stains will yield to turpentine.
