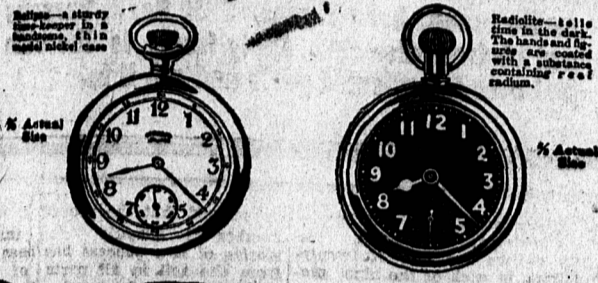

3,600,000 Signed by Actor

LARRY SEMON, FORMERLY A TELEGRAM CARTOONIST, WILL PRODUCE FILM COMEDIES

NEW YORK, Dec. 9.—The rise of Larry Seimon, comedian of the screen, from a position as cartoonist to the signing of a three-year contract that calls for \$2,000,000—one-third of it each year—almost sounds like a fairy tale. It is no comedy, for the contract has been signed by Albert E. Smith, president of the Vitaphone. As salaries go, only that of Charlie Chaplin can be placed on the same level. Mr. Smith made a special trip to Los Angeles, Cal., to close the deal. Mr. Seimon's signature to the contract was obtained at a quarter to three o'clock one morning after a conference lasting a little less than four days. Mr. Seimon's rise has been meteoric. A few years ago, he was a cartoonist on the Evening Sun, and before that a cartoonist on the Evening Telegram. He is not yet thirty years old. His contract provides him with unlimited funds to spend in the production of each of his two reel comedies, of which will make twelve each year.

On the day that Mr. Seimon signed his contract, his newest comedy, "The Headwaiter," was booked for next week in the Canto Theatre here and in the new \$1,000,000 California Theatre in Los Angeles, of which Samuel Rothapel, once manager of the Rialto and the Rivoli Theatres here, is manager.

BRITONS SUBSCRIBE TO FUND TO AID SOVIET PROPAGANDA IN GREAT BRITAIN

LONDON, Dec. 10.—John L. Baird, Unionist member of parliament from Warwickshire, announced in the chamber today, on behalf of the home secretary, that the government was aware that certain persons, some of them of foreign origin, were carrying on revolutionary propaganda in Great Britain with the object of abolishing the present government and substituting therefor government on the lines of the Soviet system in Russia. Mr. Baird added that it was known that money had been brought from abroad for this purpose. The total probably was small, but Britons also had subscribed to the fund. Information on this point, he said, was incomplete.

Miners Failed To Reach Agreement

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10.—A telegram from Attorney-General Palmer at Indianapolis received today at the White House, says the miners certainly would accept President Wilson's plan for a settlement of the strike was misinterpreted by officials there as saying the miners had accepted the plan and led to such an announcement. A correction was made immediately afterward.

The general committee of the United Mine Workers of America, meeting to consider President Wilson's proposal for ending the strike of bituminous coal miners, adjourned tonight at 8:30 o'clock without reaching an agreement. The committee will meet again tomorrow morning at nine o'clock. The miners had been in continuous session since two o'clock this afternoon when John L. Lewis, acting president of the Mine Workers' Organization presented the proposal of President Wilson to end the strike, which began more than five weeks ago.

GERMAN WARSHIPS FOR SMALL POWERS

PARIS, Dec. 9.—The Supreme Council decided today the principles on which light German warships will be divided among the smaller Powers for coast defense purposes. The Council approved the report of Naval experts concerning the allotment of material resulting from demolition of the German fleet. The destruction of the German ships will be carried out by the Powers to which they are allotted, but the time for their destruction will be prolonged. The Council decided that Turkey's gold reserves now in Berlin shall be transferred to Paris.

WORKING FOR THE HOHENZOLLERNS

GENEVA, Dec. 10.—Dr. Theobald Von Bethmann Hollweg, the former Imperial German chancellor, is reported to be at Davos. He is credited in Swiss diplomatic circles as being at the bottom of a monarchist movement in favor of both the Hohenzollerns and Hapsburgs, the nucleus of which he is said to be attempting to establish in Switzerland with the aid of several German and Austrian refugees.

TURKISH POLICE BLIND TO SCENES OF PLUNDERING

CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 9.—Constantinople is credited here with being the worst governed and highest priced city in the world. It presents a spectacle of chaos and riot. Everybody is robbing everybody else. Black-handers among the shipping agents and the longshoremen are responsible for the fact that it costs more to get freight from a ship to shore than to transport it from New York to Constantinople. All available dock space has been taken up by the Entente Powers, and Americans and citizens of other countries, who are shut out, are paying \$35 a ton to get goods from a ship through the customs. Every species of Levantine thievery has been turned loose. A modest hotel room costs from \$5 to \$8 a day, with food in proportion, although the markets are full of produce.
