Wind Promises Grief For Golfers Today

By Gayle Talbot Associated Press Sports Writer CLEVELAND, June 5.—(AP)—A strong west wind blew in off Lake Erie today, foretelling grief tomorrow in the opening 18-hole round of the National Open Golf Championships over the Canterbury Golf Club. For the last three days Clevelanders, watching the practicing professionals shoot 69's and 70's over Canterbury, have been saying ominously: "But wait until it starts to blow. These fellows haven't really played Canterbury yet." Today the breeze finally got going. Players trying out the tremendous 615-yard 18th hole, for instance, found themselves short, long right into the teeth of the blow, and the majority of them took three lousy wood shots to reach the green. Estimates on the score likely to capture the big title promptly jumped from around 25 to 200, providing the dead calm of the last several days does not return. Another result of the wind was to put Sammy Snead and Ben Hogan out in front of the field as almost prohibitive joint favorites at odds of 6 to 1. Both swat exceptionally long, low balls in any sort of weather. This will be very important over the 6,921-yard Canterbury layout. Jimmy Demaree, who yesterday was bracketed with Snead and Hogan in the tournament betting, was dropped today into a five-player group with Byron Nelson, the defending champion; Ralph Guldahl, twice previous open champion; Craig Wood, recent winner of the Metropolitan Open, and Lawson Little, two-time British and American amateur champion, at odds of 8 to 1.
