CANADIAN PACIFIC RAILWAY

An American has been chosen by the Canadian Pacific to head the department of building construction, D. H. Mapes, for the past two years connected with the Canadian Pacific but engaged for twenty-two years in building construction work, and formerly vice-president of the J. V. Schafer Jr., and Co., of New York City, one of the large construction firms of the country, is appointed superintendent of building construction. He succeeds F. L. Ellingwood, resigned. This is one of the very important posts on the railway, as the company builds its own hotels and takes a vital part in the construction of its railway stations. There are under construction at the present time about a dozen new buildings for the railway as well as several large jobs of remodelling and repairing. All of these vast works will come under the direction of an American. The Company is noted for its recognition of the merits of the American in the various departments of its organization. Sir Thomas Chubb, President, is an American who about thirty years ago came to Canada to assist Sir William Van Horne, another American, in the construction of the Canadian Pacific, now the largest transportation company in the world. 2784f

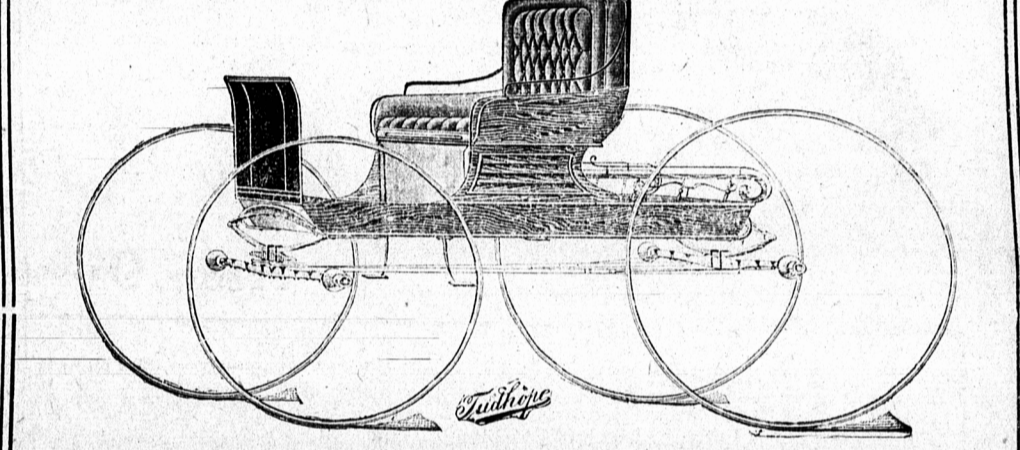

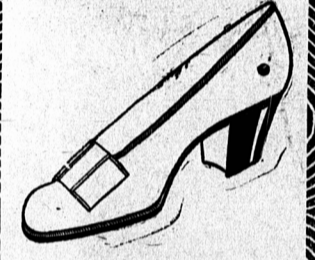

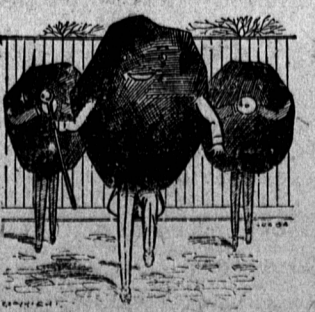
