A VERY striking full-page ad of F. Perkins & Co. drygoods merchants, Edmonton, Alberta, appears in a recent issue of Edmonton Bulletin.

MISS CLARA A. MATHEWSON, a former resident of Oyster Bed Bridge, is now living in Lacombe, Alberta, and has been appointed to the position of teacher in the school at that place.

TOMORROW, the 11th inst., will be observed throughout the province as Bible Society Sunday. Special sermons will be preached in reference to the work and needs of the Society.

THE Edmonton Bulletin of the 2nd inst. says:—Charles H. Perkins, of the firm of F. Perkins & Co., purchased the three lots on the southeast corner of Victoria and Seventh streets yesterday from A. York for \$10,000. This is one of the best residential sites left in the west end.

In connection with the vacant rectory of Trinity church, caused by the election of Rev. Canon Richardson as coadjutor bishop, three names, says the St. John Times, have been mentioned—Rev. Charles D. Schofield, of Sydney; Rev. Mr. Simpson, of Charlottetown; and Rev. Mr. Wilkinson, of St. Peter's church, Toronto. Rev. Mr. Schofield is said to be one of the most promising of the younger Episcopal clergymen of the maritime provinces. He is the son of the late George A. Schofield, and is an excellent preacher. Rev. Mr. Simpson is rector of St. Peter's church, Charlottetown, and is considered an able preacher. Rev. Mr. Wilkinson is a young man of great ability and promise. He is a graduate of Wycliffe College, Toronto. Mr. Simpson informs The Guardian that the above is the first intimation he has received of above rumor. So far as he is concerned there is no foundation for the report.

ON Tuesday next the case of Tanton versus The City Council comes up for argument before the Court of Appeal in Equity, composed of the three Supreme Court Judges. Yesterday the printed facts, or briefs of argument were filed by both parties. It is said that they are very exhaustive treatises, and that a very elaborate argument may be expected. The question to be decided is whether a ratepayer has any right to file a Bill against the governing body of a municipal Corporation, as regards illegal expenditure of the City's funds, the complainant (appellant in appeal) contending that a ratepayer has such rights, and the defendants, (respondents in appeal) contending that such action could only be taken by the Attorney-General by way of information. The question came up by way of demurrer before Mr. Justice Hodgson, the Master of the Rolls, who held that the Attorney-General alone could take proceedings, and against this judgment the complainant is now appealing. As this is the first time this question has come before the Courts of this Province the decision of the Court of Appeal will be of general interest, as it will in effect settle the practice in such cases.

SUMMERSIDE FIRE RELIEF.

SIR:—I see by the Summerside periodicals that great want and privation are anticipated in that locality, on account of the recent destructive fire. Although I have but a limited opinion, I must say that much praise is due those who, so far, contributed so generously. Meanwhile, I consider that there is one thing the Relief Committee could do, which would, to my mind, add materially to the general subscription list, i. e. to get one hundred or more, subscription lists printed, distribute them among the several teachers in the Island district schools, also to the respective clergymen in every diocese, with a modest request to solicit subscriptions from the generous and humane and I hazard the assertion that it would be productive of good monetary results.

Why, Mr. Editor, two years ago, we sent money to India, to enable the blacks to float above the sea of insufferable necessity, and this year to the famine-stricken Japan, and it is only reasonable and consistent, that we should put "our shoulders to the wheel" and make a voluntary and cheerful effort to assist our neighbors at home, in this, the time of their dire necessity. Without being presumptuous, it might be allowable for me to suggest that if the several respective clergymen would make reference from the pulpit to the wants and misery of the victims of the fire, it would materially pave the way for the subscription lists, as the Good Book says, re-charity, "He that giveth to the poor, lendeth to the Lord."
