## Latest Fads of Fashion in This Delicate Handiwork.

Bachelor buttons are attracting to a favorite place on tea and tray cloths. They are embroidered in the natural shades in Kensington button seed centers. The trac way of working them is to study the natural blossoms and match their hues with the silks. Those embroidered on a tied cloth recently seen were white at the outer edges of the petals, with a star-shaped center of lavender, blue, yellow and red and seeds of a contrasting color. These flowers combined with leaves and scrolls make a pretty decoration and are a departure from the variety of flowers that we have grown accustomed to seeing in embroidery. Jewel embroidery is liked for doilies as well as the more pretentious pieces and the bright dashes of color that ent the work enliven an otherwise commonplace pattern wonderfully. Bright little Padden flowers are very "taking" on small bits of work. A delicate spray in dull green, with a few of these quaintly gay blossoms, makes a charming decoration.

Doilies have almost universally had the button-hole edge made with white. Now there comes an innovation. Alternate colors are used in the scalloped edge, showing yellow, old blue and red in succession, while others are in green and white.

The Persian embroideries vie with the jeweled in their richness of color. In selecting silks of these, do not lose sight of the fact that the harmony of the colors must be maintained while a richness and variety of color are being sought after.

A beautiful centerpiece recently seen had a border of butterflies, wing touching wing. It was all in white. The four wings of each butterfly were of a lace braid, the medallion braid, applied with buttonhole stitch in white filo, and the goods cut away beneath the lace. The body and head of the butterfly were worked solid in white filo, and the result was exceedingly good.—J. D. Cowie, in Chicago Record.

**New Table Appointments**  
Grape scissors are made much in the fashion of lampwick clippers, except that they are gorgeous with silver clustered grape and large leaf designs. No ice-cream set is complete without pronged silver spoons. They are a good substitute for forks, being a compromise between them and the regulation spoon.

The changes in napery are not very marked. Pure white still holds its own against any colored damask or tinted satin. The designs most in favor are the floral patterns.

Two-pointed spears, the handles shaped like corn shears, lying at the side of one's plate indicates corn as a course. If properly served the corn is broken into halves or smaller bits and so easily speared and held.

The small bonbon dish is to be replaced by huge Holland spoons designed for the same purpose. These are made with long handles in dull silver or copperish gold, in imitation of the ancient ones that used to be attached by chains to the old Dutch heartstones.

The new berry spoons are all repousse with berry designs, and generally perforated, the pointed orange spoon remains in high favor, while for sliced cucumbers there are pronged and perforated spoons, and for pie forks with one broad, sharp-edged prong and two narrow ones.
