Horse races were held at many points of the Maritimes on the 24th. They raced half-mile heats instead of the regulation mile because the horses were not sufficiently conditioned to go the full distance. The fastest time was made by Royal Hanover 2.04 1/4 in winning the Free-for-All at Charlottetown track, North Sydney, from a good field which included Marjorie M. Time 1.06. At Middleton, Signal Senator 2.08 1/4 won from King Spruce 2.10 and Marvin Brooke 2.04 1/4, best time 1.06 1/4.

At Saint John, Lee Jones of Wickham, N.B., showed up a real one in Volo Ray 2.05, by Volomite 1.03 1/4. Mr. Jones bought him in Kentucky and he appears to be one of the best horses eligible to the seventeen class in the Maritime Provinces. Last year he made nine starts, winning three races. At Wrensville, Ohio, August 20th, he was 1-1-1 in 2:11, 2:08, 2:12. His second heat was the fastest of the meeting. At Lucasville, Ohio, August 20th he was 1-1-1 in 2:09 1/4, 2:07 1/4, and at Dayton, Ohio, September 8th, he was 1-1-1 in 2:06, 2:11, 2:11.
