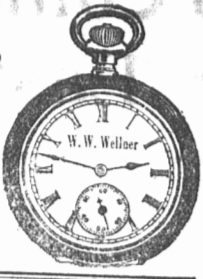

ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

HOCKEY tonight.
The Druggists will struggle with the Army Medical Corps tonight.

The steamer Elliot, which goes sailing this season, sailed from Halifax Sunday night for Newfoundland, where she will take her boatmen and hunters on board and proceed to the sealing waters. She took a crew of thirteen from here, the only resident Haligonian being Capt. James Downey, of Cunard Court, who went as first officer. John T. McLaue, of P. E. Island went as second officer. Jos. H. Clark and F. G. Pelly of Charlottetown as Chief and Second Engineer respectively.

The hockey match on Friday evening, Pictou vs. New Glasgow, drew a large crowd. The teams as they faced off were very evenly matched, the Pictou team being greatly strengthened by two players from Charlottetown, Music at point, and Unsworth at left wing. Each team had scored three goals when the time was up, and the game closed in this unsatisfactory way as in the matter of playing each team seemed as good as the other. The game was an exceptionally fast one throughout and a lot of off-side play and stick whacking was indulged in though the referee punished the offenders as best he could. The game was an hour late in starting owing to trouble in getting a referee. Mr. Harrington, of Halifax was at last prevailed upon to perform the duties and make a satisfactory referee.—New Glasgow Chronicle.

APPLE SHIPMENTS.

Senator Ferguson Thinks More Care Should be Exercised.

(St. John Sun.)
Senator Ferguson of P. E. Island has for the past few years been endeavoring with a fair amount of success, to work up apple shipments from P. E. Island to England, but is not altogether pleased with the manner in which the shipments are handled on this side. Speaking to the Sun, Senator Ferguson said that sufficient care was not exercised by those who furnish freight to the steamers. As an instance he spoke of his most recent shipment. He had been advised from Halifax that the Furness steamer Loyalist would be ready to receive the apples on Friday last, and in consequence of this advice he sent them over in time to reach Halifax on Friday. Later he learned that the ship would not be ready until Tuesday, and that the apples would most probably remain in Halifax in care for fully five days. During this time Senator Ferguson believes they must be subject to a certain amount of carelessness or neglect on the part of the freight employes, and being subject to changes of temperature, would not derive any benefit from their delay. He thinks that those who handle the apples should be able to advise shippers more nearly as to the time the apples will be required, and thus avoid the possibility of injury by heat or cold.
