**WINNIPEG, Jan. 15 (CP)—**Wheat futures prices made an irrevocable show on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today and closed 1-8 to 2-1-2 cents higher with May at \$2.03 1-2 July \$1.98 3-8 and Oct. \$1.79 1-2.

Small losses were shown in early trading but the market rallied as the session advanced and offerings dried up. Buying by local interest featured the late trading.

**CHICAGO, Jan. 15 (AP)—**Grain futures wandered around in today's trading under the nervous leadership of rye.

At the opening rye was 1-3 cent higher in the market as much as 7-8 cent on reports that no rye had been authorized for foreign purchase in February for the first time since 1914, but did not show as much bounce, and the dip in wheat was only minor fractions.

**TORONTO, Jan. 15 (CP)—**The Western Oils crowded into the spotlight on the Toronto Exchange today and chalked up enough gains to give the group an index lift of about a point to a new high for recent years. Both mining groups netted significant index gains.

Most of the Western Oils traded in volume. Calgary and Edmonton turned over 11,000 shares and made a 2-4 Home gain of 1-4 to 4-5 and minor gains were netted by Anglo-Canadian, Canadian, Davina, East Crest, Highwood-Sarce, British-Dominion, Mid-Continent, Pacalta and United.

The close was down narrowly for Dalhousie, Pacific Pete and Okalta. Royal set 1-4.

**MONTREAL, Jan. 15 (CP)—**Industrials and banks managed to expand gains secured in recent general upswing on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market but utilities, papers and golds on average looked a breather in industrials and banks reached new high levels in the indices and the other groups were down. Number of different stocks traded at 264 was an all-time high. In the stronger spots, individual rises ran from fractions to 5 points.

**NEW YORK, Jan. 15 (AP)—**The Stock Market scored another 15-year average high today in fast dealings although profit cashing on the recent sharp upswing reduced early gains running in a point or more and jolted many leaders for slight losses.

General ideas stemming from the trends later but a number of issues slipped at the close. The Blue Chips such as Eastman Kodak, Allied Chemical, added 4 and 5 points although fractional advances ruled at the close.

Buying again was predicated on industrial ideas, although the apparent price-wage spiral and the belief that, when strikes and threatened strikes are adjusted, the country is entering a period of boom-time prosperity.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 4 of a point at 78.4, a top since March 26, 1931.
