THE CAPITAL OF THE WEST

Latest from Summerside and Prince County.

The annual meeting of the Summerside Board of Trade takes place tomorrow evening.

The funeral of the late Miss McPhail takes place at 1:30 p. m. today to Wilmet cemetery.

New stations will be constructed shortly at Northam, Richmond, Fredericton, Albany, Kinkora. The contracts will be awarded in a few days, the time for receiving tenders having expired.

The Summerside Journal and Agriculturist has issued a calendar which is creditable to that printing establishment. It contains a cut of A. A. Lefurgey, M. P., and the general make-up is neat and artistic.

The late Miss Janetta McPhail whose death occurred on Friday evening as chronicled in this column on Saturday was born in Inverness-shire, Scotland and was about seventy years of age. She emigrated to this country with her parents the late William and Mrs. McPhail, first settling in Nova Scotia. In 1884 they removed to Orwell, P. E. Island. The late Miss McPhail passed the board of education from the Central Academy in Charlottetown and began her teaching career first giving private lessons before she was fourteen years of age. She took charge of her first school when fifteen years old and followed this profession for forty years in different parts of the island, the last thirteen of which she taught in the Eastern District School, Summerside. As a teacher of the young Miss McPhail had no equal in this province at least. She always had a large class of scholars who learned to love and obey her. Besides the usual branches which go with an ordinary school education the scholars under the instruction of Miss McPhail received a most thorough course as far as their intellect would carry them in the study of the Bible, in the rule which applies to morality and religion, and in general etiquette coming of good citizens. Kindergarten work which was introduced in this Province chiefly through her instrumentality was first taught in its general principles by Miss McPhail who attached much importance to its educative feature. She had the happy faculty of teaching the young to take a deep interest in the lesson given by her, and under her charge children became teachers each one of his or her juniors. And to-day few could look with more pride at the long list of leaders of men in the different professions than could she. Many of our clergymen, our lawyers, doctors and educators owe their strength in the profession of their choice largely to the schooling received under the able and painstaking instruction of Miss McPhail. Among other teachers she was universally looked upon as a model educator, and her papers read before the Teachers' Institutes, her untiring work to advance all the principles of educative methods always found appreciative followers. Miss McPhail was early admitted into

the branch of the Established Church of Scotland organized and presided over by the late Rev. Donald McDonald, and lived a true Christian life. Up to the time of her death the Holy Bible was the rule of her faith and morals and consequently governed in all her labors, ever keeping in mind the Golden Rule. All questions of dispute, all troubles to be overcome were settled by her teaching from the pages of the great Book. To the poor she was ever a true friend, and many acts of kindness even at a sacrifice to herself bear for her happy remembrances in the hearts of those who found comfort in her charity. Surviving her are two sisters Mrs. Stephen Schurman of Terrell, Texas who was present with her during the last few weeks of illness and Mrs. John Dickleson with whom she lately lived, besides one brother Wm. McPhail lately Bursar at Falconwood Hospital, Charlottetown.
