LARGEST MAJORITY YET FOR GOVERNMENT

LONDON, April 30—The House of Commons yesterday, after two days of debate which had been characterized by interruptions on the part of a small section of the Laborites who came into frequent conflict with the Speaker's chair, passed the second reading of the government's housing bill. Previously the House defeated a motion for rejection by a vote of 340 to 140. This is the largest majority the government has yet secured.
