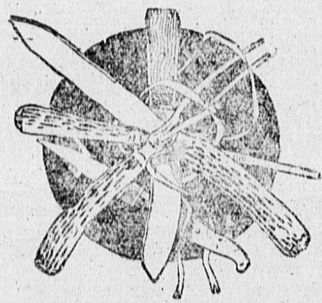

## CONDITIONS NOT FAIRLY STATED

TORONTO, Oct. 21—Inspector David Cheney of Windsor, in an interview today, does not assert that the bilingual system of education is by any means perfect—he admits that it has flaws—but he contends that they are defects which arise from certain conditions among their deficient organizations. "Conditions," he said, "have been unfairly stated by Bishop Fallon, and unduly exaggerated. The Bishop has not had time to inquire fully into these things personally. I believe those who gave him the information upon which he bases his attack are sincere, but they have not been at pains to get to the bottom of the matter. The charge as to illiteracy is particularly exaggerated. I am sorry to have to acknowledge that there is a lot of illiteracy among our French people, but I cannot say that the teaching of French is the cause. The cause I think are two. One is the indifference of many of our French people in poor circumstances. I do not wish it to be understood that the French people are in a condition of poverty, but it is a fact that many of them, industrious though they are, have a hard fight to keep body and soul together. "There are a fair number who take a deep interest in education, but there is a larger number who are apathetic. Another cause I think is the difficult task set our French children in learning the English language. "It is claimed that English is not taught enough in our schools, but I do not think that claim is justified. Along the river front the French schools are just as good as the English schools in our neighborhood. I have no hesitation in saying our best French schools will compare with the best English schools. "NORTH BAY, Ont., Oct. 19—The result of the entrance examinations in three northern towns is as follows:—35 out of 48 pupils from English schools passes, 19 out of the 30 pupils from Irish schools passes, six out of eleven pupils from French schools passes. "There are about sixty bilingual rural schools from Mattawa to Sudbury. They rarely send up any pupils for entrance. "TORONTO, Oct. 19—In a long article today the Orange Sentinel dwells on the Fallon arguments over bilingual schools and points out that such have been a hindrance to progress in those parts of Canada where they have existed for some time. The Sentinel figures out that both Reaume and Hanna have blundered badly and their presence in the cabinet must be embarrassing to Sir James Whitney.

## AN INTERPROVINCIAL CONFERENCE.

TORONTO, Oct. 24—As a result of the discussion among legal representatives of the Canadian provinces, Premiers Gouin and Whitney may be asked to convene another formal interprovincial conference. "The questions under discussion are the advisability of appealing from the Order of the Supreme Court upon the question of its own jurisdiction regarding the right of Provincial Companies, the Dominion's jurisdiction to pass certain sections of the Insurance Act, and in reference to British Columbia and other fisheries. "The question of the representation of the different Provinces to the Dominion House of Commons was brought forward by representatives from the Maritime Provinces, and their views were argued and discussed. "Further conferences on this subject will probably take place at a future date when the premiers of the other Provinces may be present.

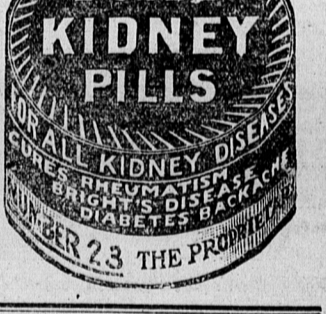
## THE OLD HOMESTEAD.
