**WEDNESDAY FROM BONSBAW.**—The gasoline launch "Derry" came down from Bonsbaw yesterday, the first launch out this season.

**THE WILLIAM AITKEN.**—Yesterday the Tug William Aitken, Capt. Batt, made a number of trips to Rocky Point with passengers. The drift ice which crowded into the wharf made the trips somewhat difficult but with skilful tacking the Tug's crew managed to get her across all right.

**A PROMOTION.**—The many friends of the Rev. John McKinnon, late of Hopewell, will be glad to learn that he has been elected Professor of Gaelic in the University of Edinburgh. Mr. McKinnon was a native of P.E. Island, and was educated at the West River Seminary of the Presbyterian Church of Nova Scotia, at Durham Pictou Co. —Pictou Advocate.

**AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE.**—Mrs. Rogers and His Honour Governor Rogers entertained, at a delightful dinner last night, at Government House, members of the Provincial Legislature and other gentlemen to the number of about twenty. Government House seldom looked prettier than on this occasion, the floral decorations being exceedingly artistic. The color scheme in the dining room was green and white, the table being set in green, with green candles and shades, and faintly brightened with lilies of the valley and ferns. The drawing rooms were decorated with Easter lilies, jonquils and white roses. Needless to say the dinner was in keeping with the best traditions of Government House and the evening was delightfully spent until 10.30 when the guests said good night to their hostess and host. The second dinner to members of the Legislature will be held Thursday evening.

**FIRST MAIL.**—That the government steamer Stanley had arrived at the Magdalen Islands early yesterday morning with the first quantity of postal matter delivered there since last autumn was the information received in a relayed wireless from Pictou by Charles H. Harvey, agent of marine and fisheries in the exchange. The Stanley carried the mails from North Sydney, landing them at Amherst and Grindstone, the chief towns of the gulf group. She will remain north until this afternoon for the return mails, after which she will leave for Halifax via St. Paul's Island. In breaking her way thru the ice fields to the Magdalens, the Stanley was stuck in the ice off St. Paul's Island for several hours. The arrival of this steamship in the Magdalens marked the first outside

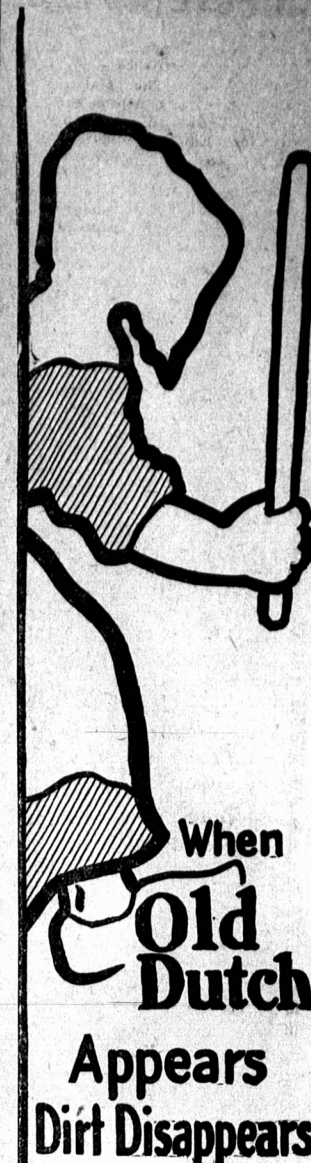
craft to be seen there for many months, as during the late autumn and the winter they are shut away from the outside world by a great expanse of ice-fields. The regular summer boat to the Magdalens, the Lady Sybil, is now overhauling at Dartmouth, preparatory to resuming the service. On her arrival the Stanley will be attached to the Nova Scotia agency, while the Aberdeen, subsequently to the effecting repairs to her hull, will proceed to St. John and be commissioned in the New Brunswick district.

**THURSDAY FORTY HOURS CLOSURE.**—The Forty Hours Devotion closed in St. Dunstan's Pro-Cathedral, Charlottetown, Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock. The High Mass of Reposition was celebrated by Rev. Father Allan Macdonald, Fort Augustus.

**GOOD NEWS.**—The following is a copy of a telegram received in Charlottetown, dated Reno, March 27th: "Glad things are looking so well. Returned from mine this morning. We are breaking six feet of rich ore for shipment. Have better than four cars out. Road work, ore bins, railroad spur, are all being pushed. Will be shipping April 10th. We have the best mine in Rochester—Nothing but success for us." The telegram was signed A. A. Codd, and will be good news to a large number throughout this province.

**RAILWAY NEEDED.**—Mr. Simon Pinea of Rustico, one of the leading lobster packers in the province was in Charlottetown yesterday. In conversation with The Guardian Mr. Pinea spoke of the serious lack of transportation facilities at Rustico. One of the best farming sections of the province and probably its largest fishing centre, obliged to haul all its produce and supplies a distance of nine miles to the nearest shipping point, Hunter River, is certainly a condition that requires to be looked into. A branch line from Hunter River to Rustico along the river valley would be a comparatively easy solution of the difficulty. The lobster business alone at Rustico amounts to about half a million dollars a year all of which has to be carted over nine miles of road, most of it in the spring when the roads are at their worst. If any part of the province needs a railway it is Rustico.

**WOMEN'S INSTITUTES.**—This week Mrs. A. E. Dunbreck and Miss Kathrine James are organizing Women's Institutes in the neighborhood of Charlottetown. On Monday evening they addressed a meeting at the Farmers' Institute and the Women's Institute, which was organized some time since. Mr. T. A. Benson was also present and spoke on Eggs Circles. On Tuesday afternoon they went to Marshfield and addressed a meeting of the ladies in the school and are to-day at Union. The meeting at Marshfield was not large but was very enthusiastic and they have fully decided upon an organization. It is not expected that any of these meetings will be large as the Institutes are supposed to centre around a school district. In each school district if the women of the school district wish it. At any rate it is not intended that one Institute shall cover more than three school districts. Wherever possible the meetings will be held in the school, and it is hoped that the women of the District working with the Supervisor, who will make regular visits, will do much not only for the improvement of home and social life but also for the immediate benefit of the school without which home and social life cannot be uplifted. Next week Mrs. Dunbreck and Miss James will address meetings with the idea of organizing at Cornwall, Monday April 7th, Clyde River on Tuesday, April 8th, Kingston, April 9th, Hampshire, April 10th, and North Wiltshire, April 11th.
