D. C. Schurman, a native of North Quebec, has been selected as trustee Edward Island's nominee for a \$500 post-graduate scholarship in scientific agriculture to be held at Macdonald College, Ste Anne de Bellevue, Que., and leading to the degree of M. Sc. This is one of ten scholarships annually contributed by W. C. Macdonald Reg'd. Inc., tobacco Manufacturers of Montreal. By reason of the bilingual situation, two of these scholarships go to Quebec. Each of the remaining provinces is entitled to nominate a candidate. In donating these scholarships W. C. Macdonald Reg'd. Inc., is following out the policy of the founder of the business, the late Sir William Macdonald, who in his lifetime gave many millions of dollars to the advancement of scientific and technical education in the Dominion. Sir William was one of Canada's pioneer business men and his vision was so broad he realized from the outset of his career that facilities for training scientific agriculturalists and developing skilled practitioners in the various branches of engineering were essential for a proper development of the Dominion's basic industry, agriculture, and of her natural resources. With this in mind he made many princely benefactions, notable among which are those that established the Macdonald College, Ste Anne de Bellevue, Que., one of the finest agricultural institutes in the world, at which the scholarships donated annually by W. C. Macdonald Reg'd. Inc., are tenable.

Mr. Schurman who will represent the late Sir William's native province at this year's post graduate course, was born in 1885 and attended country school and Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown, from which he received his first class certificate in 1904. From 1904 until 1912 he worked on the farm at his home and in 1913 he entered Nova Scotia Agricultural College, Truro, receiving the associate diploma with honours, in 1915. He was graduated from the Ontario Agricultural College, Guelph, in 1917, having specialized in Horticulture. He spent four years as post-graduate student at the Experimental Station, Charlottetown, and has since had charge of the cultural plots.

Crop Report Below will be found a brief synopsis of telegraphic reports received at the Head Office of the Bank of Montreal from its Branches. The Branch Managers have complete and intimate knowledge of each local situation and are in close touch with Crop conditions in all sections of the districts mentioned.

GENERAL Harvesting in the Prairie Provinces has been delayed by rain but is now proceeding under satisfactory conditions. Practically all the wheat has been cut and threshing is becoming general. In Quebec the harvest of grain has been satisfactory and some districts have suffered damage by wind and rain but average crops are expected. In Ontario harvesting of grain is practically completed and threshing returns are above the average; late crops need warm dry weather. In the Maritime Provinces favourable weather has prevailed the harvest is well under way. In British Columbia crops have been improved by general heavy rains. Details follow:—

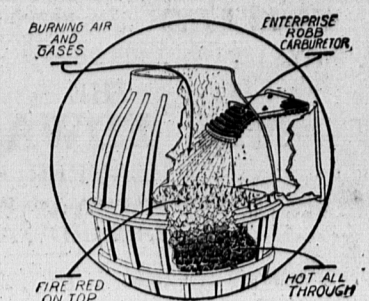
PRAIRIE PROVINCES EDMONTON DISTRICT.—Practically all wheat and 75% oats cut and harvesting now out; threshing commenced but held up few days at some points owing to heavy rains; yield varies from poor to fair; frost damage is patchy and largely confined to Eastern section of province where yield and grade will be adversely affected. REGINA DISTRICT.—Cutting practically completed conceiving some fields of flax; threshing well under way; yield and grade of grain already threshed in south of province satisfactory but later fields in east have suffered from frost. WINNIPEG DISTRICT.—Wheat is practically all cut and about 90% coarse grains; operations delayed by rain are now proceeding under favourable conditions; deliveries to date have graded high but some grain now coming forward is showing effect of rust and frost.

PROVINCE OF QUEBEC Roots are not as good as previously expected due to the excessive moisture which caused rot in the lower lands, however, the crop is still expected to be a good average one. Crops in general are expected to be up to average.

PROVINCE OF ONTARIO Warm dry weather is needed to ripen corn and late fruit crops; the corn sorer is causing damage in the lower lands, however, the crop is still expected to be a good average one. Crops in general are expected to be up to average.

PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA Grain harvest now completed, yield average 90% and 80% of normal; hop picking almost completed; high grade crop assured; all crop tomatoes being harvested; Macintosh apples practically finished; Jonathans well on the way; some damage through wind falls in Okanagan. The apple crop estimate of 65% of normal remains unchanged. Pasturage improved by rain.

CORPORAL REUBEN N. WATTS Corporal Reuben Nelson Watts, who passed away on the 25th January in the 26th year, was the youngest son of Fred W. and Mrs. Watts, York. He enlisted in the 102nd and was afterwards transferred to the 13th Battalion, which did some of the heaviest fighting in the war. He crossed over to France, Nov. 19th, 1916 and for two years was engaged in almost continuous fighting till finally gassed and wounded at Cambrai.
