BRACEBRIDGE, Ont., Feb. 10.—About 10 o'clock last night Thomas McDivitt, eldest son of Wm McDivitt, proprietor of the Windsor Hotel, was instantly killed. He went to the acetylene gas house with a lantern, and opening the door an explosion occurred. The doors struck him with terrific force, breaking both arms and fracturing his skull, causing instant death.

LONDON, Feb. 10.—Many have been mentioned but none yet chosen to succeed Earl Grey in Canada. A paper says that the Canadian Associated Press learns that Earl Carrington is of the opinion that no man over 50 should accept the post of Governor General in the colony although he would not state definitely that he would not do so, there is reason to believe he would not. The post has, however, been offered to him.

CAR AND SEVEN MEN BLOWN TO ATOMS.

PHOENIX, Ari., Feb. 10.—Headless of the warnings of a foreman in charge of excavating operations along the line of the private motor road from Kelvin to the Ray coppel the motorman of a gasolene car containing six engineers employed by the company ran his car close to a sputtering fuse of a heavy charge of dynamite today, and the car and its seven occupants were blown to atoms.

The foreman had discovered a miss shot in the excavation at noon and before the motor came in sight he had relighted the fuse. As the car appeared he signalled the motor man and warned him of the impending explosion. Motorman Lyalle, evidently believing he could take his car past the charge before the explosion, paid no heed to the warning and started at full speed.

Just as the car was passing the charge the explosion came and the car was blown high in the air amid a great cloud of debris. The dead men were all prominent in mining affairs in Arizona.

COUPLE HAVE SOLVED PROBLEM OF LIVING.

CHICAGO, Ill., Feb. 12.—Otto Meyer and his wife Mary have solved the difficulties attending the high cost of living so far as they are concerned. They have lived for years on a 30 acre farm near the village of Riverside, Cook County.

By a deed filed in the recorder's office yesterday Meyer for a consideration of \$6,000 in cash conveyed to his son Fritz H. Meyer the farm. But in return for this, the elder Meyer is to be furnished with all the necessities of life, including a house, regardless of the market price as long as he or his wife live.

A part of this unique deed reads as follows:

"The grantee is to provide a sufficient supply of fruit, a sufficient supply of vegetables of all kinds to be delivered on demand, one dressed hog of 230 pounds weight, one four-quarter of fresh beef to be delivered on Dec. 15 in each year, one half dozen fat ducks, one half dozen fat roosters, dressed, to be delivered on Nov. 1 of each year and three barrels of best quality of wheat flour to be delivered, one barrel each time on Jan. 1st, May 1st, and Sept. 1st of each year, twenty bushels of good eatable potatoes to be delivered on demand, two pounds of fresh butter each week, one dozen fresh eggs each week, one quart of fresh milk and \$40 in cash, \$20 on July 1 in each year."

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Feb. 10.—George Reynolds and John Williams, negroes, were hanged this morning for assault, this making the first time the death penalty has been inflicted in Missouri for this crime.

The negroes, on the night of December 23, 1909, attacked Mrs. W. H. Jackson, a violinist, who was returning from a charitable institution, where she had given a concert.

Reynolds collapsed a few hours before the execution, and it was necessary to carry him to the trap on a chair. When the chair was removed he fell limp on the trap door, moaning piteously. Williams who had been known for years as a desperate character, remained brave to the last. Even while standing on the scaffold he forced a smile. Mrs Jackson's husband witnessed the hangings.
