IS FLORENCE KINRADE QUITTING THE COUNTRY?

MONTREAL, May 12.—Florence Kinrade, her mother and Mr. Wright left Montreal at eight o'clock yesterday morning on the train that goes to Portland. It is thought that the latter place is their destination, as from what they let drop it is the intention of Florence at least to sail for England to join Mrs. Warburton, formerly Miss Elliott, with a view of going on the music hall stage there. The name under which she is to appear is not known. Monday night the party refused to see anyone, though Miss Kinrade and her mother later came down to the parlor of the hotel and Florence played on the piano. Yesterday morning they were up early and had breakfast in the general dining room. Wright paid the bill for the three, and they walked to the station, straight to the train. They did not buy tickets and the ticket seller does not know where they were bound. The train goes to Portland, but anyone going to Quebec can take the same train and change at Richmond. The baggage, it is said, was sent straight to the ship's side. Yesterday afternoon Wright and Florence went to Jess Applegath's, where she bought a hat. The manager, Mr. Tatro, is a former Hamiltonian, and recognized Florence and chatted with them. When he called her by her name she flushed and then went

pale, but did not deny that she was the Florence Kinrade. In case they went to Quebec they would stay for a week before they could get a ship to England, so it is almost positive that they went to Portland. It is not known whether Wright or Mrs. Kinrade will go also. There is another theory which several of those who saw them have developed, that Wright and Florence are married and that this is the wedding tour. Several of the people at the hotel thought that they were a newly-wedded couple till they heard who they were. When they asked for a summer resort time table yesterday they did not get one, as the supply was exhausted, but they displayed no great anxiety and took a simple time table in place of it.
