Five years ago today the steamer Petrol arrived in Summerside to test the Cape Tormentine route, the result of which is known to most of readers.

ARRANGEMENTS are about to be made to hold an excursion on the steamer Stanley to Cape Tormentine thence over the N. B. and P. E. I. R. to Sackville and return on New Year's day.

ONE of the biggest, finest signs of the approach of Christmas is a turkey weighing twenty-eight pounds, dressed ready for cooking on exhibition in Mr. Levi Silphant's meat shop. The bird was one of a lot purchased from Mr. Benj. Tanton, St. Eleanor.

CAPT. CAMERON has assured us that the Northumberland will continue on the Summerside Pt. du Chene route during the balance of this week. Judging from the present cold weather it is not safe to guarantee anything further than this. It is probable then that the Stanley will be ordered on the Summerside Tormentine route the first of next week.

THERE will be an exhibition in the Manual Training School, Summerside, of the pupils' work and drawing. Parents and all interested in manual work will be cordially welcomed to visit and see the progress made since the opening of the school in January last. The exhibition will be opened on Monday next, Dec. 23rd from 9.30 to 12 o'clock in the morning and from 1.30 to 4.30 in the afternoon.

THE case against Daniel Loder, charged with firing Mr. Frank Jelly's barn, Linkletter Road, was up for hearing before Mr. Leonard Morris, J. P., yesterday afternoon. After taking the evidence of the prosecutor and his brother, Mr. Edward Jelly, the prisoner was remanded until Monday next, when the prosecutor hoped to bring further evidence. In the testimonies given it appeared that Mr. Frank Jelly was keeping company with a young lady at whose home the accused was hired. It is alleged that Loder had made certain threats which give reason for more suspicion, he having expressed his intention of interfering with any one who would step between himself and the girl. The case has evoked much interest and the court room was well filled during the investigation. Mr. Jelly estimates his loss at \$800 with \$100 insurance.

Tax people of Prince County will be satisfied only when the Stanley is making daily trips between Summerside and Cape Tormentine and express trains both east and west are making connections with the steamer. The eyes of the people are upon the officers controlling these affairs, and as never before the public is determined to have the rights of the western people given them. Summerside expects to get its share of the traffic this coming winter in railway communication with eastern points and steamboat connections with the mainland; but we must not forget that train arrangements west of Summerside need to be adjusted satisfactory to the people of West Prince who have been so long asking redress for their grievance in this respect. The west has long agitated for two trains a day during winter; they have made their claims honestly, fairly and emphatically; they have shown why their demands are just, how the terms of confederation allow for better accommodation than has been, how the traffic requires more trains, how the railway receipts warrant an improved service, they have expressed the people's wish for better conditions. These matters have been presented earnestly and straight forward to the highest officials; and a delegation, appointed at a public meeting fairly represented, have received the best encouragement in their efforts. Then in the name of justice their requests should receive due recognition and these claims fully acceded to.
