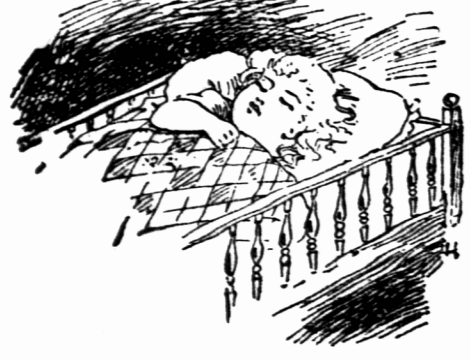

THAT CANNIBAL FEAST.

Some Particulars of the Massacre.

VICTORIA, B. C., October 10.—News received from Australia by the Warri-mo states that the head hunters, a cannibal faction of the natives of Rendova, captured a village lately and after slaughtering many inhabitants, returned home with 30 prisoners, who were killed and eaten at a barbaric feast. One of the most notorious of the Head hunting chiefs has since been captured by the British.

Vancouver, B. C., October 9.—There has been a native uprising in the New Hebrides. It started by an attack made by the natives upon the French company station at Espiritu Santo. The news reached Noumea, New Caledonia, by the steamer La France on the 22nd ult. The British cruiser Miduirra at once set out from Villa for the scene. The hill tribes had surrounded the company station, occupying all the roads leading from it and as they were fully armed, the overseers and laborers employed there were in the greatest peril. Later news is to the effect that the Miduirra has succeeded in affording the protection required, the natives retreating to the hills upon the approach of the warship. H. M. S. Mohawk has returned to Sydney from the Solomon group.

She has been on a punitive expedition among the islands. Among the villages visited was that of Vella La Vell. The natives of this place were concerned in a murderous attack made on Captain Pratt, a well known island trader. The Mohawk landed an armed party who fired the native huts and destroyed the plantations. Subsequently the Mohawk called at Simbo and arrested the chief of the village there in connection with a massacre of another aborigine tribe. Some native girls had been carried off by Simbo as prisoners, and the Captain of the warship endeavored to obtain their release, but all to no avail and the chief was taken to Taligu for trial before the British commissioner. While on the Mohawk the chief became very violent. He was placed in irons but a few days later, after being transferred to H. M. S. Goldfinch, tried to escape by jumping over board. The ship's boats were promptly lowered and he was returned to the warship and subsequently handed over to the native police at Tulagi. H. M. S. Mohawk has proceeded to the Santa Cruz group. The ceremony of the annexation of these islands is now in progress.
