MONTREAL, July 3-(CP)—New York and Shanghai dollars, at 24.59 and 5.44 cents respectively, were off a shade in terms of the United States dollar in today's dull foreign exchange dealings. The Canadian dollar at a discount of 11 5-8 per cent and the pound sterling at \$4.03 1-2 ended unchanged as were other major currencies. Ottawa's Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 9.03-9.91 per cent discount.

MONTREAL, July 3-(CP)—Volume stepped up on the stock exchange today.
Brazilian was again the market leader and moved to a new high. In other directions prices were irregular fractionally, with declines up-pest.
Shawinigan and Montreal Power slipped slightly along with Winnipeg Electric preferred. Power Corporation won a modest advance.
International Nickel and Noranda finished with increases. Bathurst firmed, St. Lawrence Corporation hit a new low, and Dryden moved into the loss camp.
Doseco "B" was ahead but General Steel Wares, National Steel Car and Canada Cement slipped, C. P.R. was on the upgrade. Celanese was a strong spot but behind were National Breweries, Good-year preferred, at a new low, Ogilvie and Imperial Tobacco.
Total sales: 15,800 shares; Industrials 11,700; M.nes, 4,100; Bonds \$300.

Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, July 3-(CP)—The gold stocks finished the day with losses predominating on the Toronto stock exchange while other groups showed minor net gains. Volume was 130,000 shares.
Wright-Hargreaves dropped to its low for recent years at 3.85, off 15 cents. Smaller declines were recorded by East Maric, Kerr-Addison, Perron, Pickle Crow, Sylvanite, Teek Hughes and Upper Canada. Final prices were up narrowly for Buffalo-Ankerite, Centria, Patricia, Chesterville, Madson and O'Brien. Sheep Rock gained a cent. About 14,000 shares of the stock changed hands. Noranda was up a fraction. Nickel added 3-8 and Falconbridge added 5 cents. Pind Orville weakened 2 cents.
Brazilian had a turnover of 2,400 shares and the price firmed 5-8 to a new high for the year at 8 1-8. Other leaders to do better were Fanny Farmer, Ford A, Canada Bread A, Canadian Celanese, and Langley's pfd.
Closing prices were lower for Bank of Toronto, Fleet Aircraft, Gypsum, Loblaw A, Silverwoods pfd and Consolidated Paper.
Home Oil firmed a point and Anglo-Canadian firmed slightly. Extension Oil gained 1-2.

NEW YORK, July 3-(AP)—The stock market maintained its balance today in the face of cloudier war news, prospects of a record tax bill and indications of further federal restrictions on industry.
Mild forward tendencies were displayed by most leaders at the start in fairly active dealings. There was some let-down in prices after mid-day but fractional advances were well in the majority at the close.
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks held a net gain of 1 of a point at 41.8. Transfers expanded to 463,770 shares.
Brokers reported considerable short covering by those who wanted to have a fairly clean slate over tomorrow's holiday when all major markets will recess.
New highs for the year were posted by Pepsi-Cola, whose directors voted a \$1 dividend late yesterday. American Woolen pfd and Atlantic Gulf and West Indies common and pfd.
Southern Railway, Great Northern and Chesapeake and Ohio were a shade head.
Douglas Aircraft, Glenn Martin, Sperry, United Aircraft and Consolidated Aircraft showed modest improvement.
General Motors and Chrysler were under water as the automobile makers were warned they might have to triple their defence production load.
Pirelli of Italy (American shares) slumped 38 1-2 points to 37 1-2 on the first sale since June 7.
