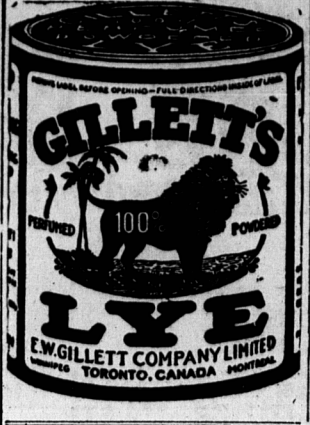

VICTORIA, B. C., July 25. — That Orientals are getting an increasingly firm grip on British Columbia's produce trade is indicated by figures compiled by the Provincial Department of Agriculture, which have just been made public.

ed by Chinese. In the famous Ashcroft and Lil-looet districts, Chinese now own 2,500 acres and lease 1,905 acres more, the report shows. Their holdings in these districts are in blocks, running as high as 640 acres. Recently more sales of land have been made direct from the white farmer who finds he cannot make production pay, to the Oriental.

Officials of the Department of Agriculture are now investigating records to find out just how land is acquired by the Japanese. Two Japanese in one district were interrogated says the report, and explained that in acquiring land the system was for the Japanese purchaser to make a selection, and when the purchase was approved by the Japanese consul the price was paid by the official. Of the 4,500 acres of small fruit in British Columbia, 2,341 acres are controlled by Japanese.

CUSTOMS IN BRITAIN LOOK GOOD IN JAPAN

TOKIO, July 25.—Changes, democratic in nature, will probably be made for the court life of Japan, and in the relations of the Imperial family to the people, as a result of the visit of Prince Hirohito to Europe. It is likely that the printing of photographs of members of the Imperial family in newspapers and magazines will be permitted. The military guards which are always established on the occasion of a visit of a member of the Imperial family to any place outside the palace will also be amplified, if the suggestions which have been formulated by officers of the Imperial household are accepted.
