MEAT INSPECTION

In the course of his speech during the debate on the Address Dr. S. F. Jenkins, M. L. A., referred very appropriately to the imperative need of meat inspection for this province.

The subject has been discussed in The Guardian but its importance cannot be too frequently emphasized. Fifty years ago this Island colony was proverbially healthy.

Tuberculosis was practically unknown. To-day we have the same climate, the same pure air, the same health-giving breezes from the ocean.

Notwithstanding many precautions and many prudent safeguards, tuberculosis occurs by no means uncommon. Outbreaks occur which cannot be accounted for on the grounds of either contagion, heredity or environment.

It will be remembered that of the pork officially inspected for export a large proportion—twenty per cent if we remember aright—was condemned as unfit for human food.

The anomaly of inspecting meat for export, while indiscriminately using on our tables everything offered without regard to its healthfulness or to its origin, is we believe confined to Prince Edward Island.

meat allowed to go into consumption without having passed through a public abattoir or a registered private slaughterhouse where it is subjected to proper medical inspection.

The governments of our sister provinces, recognizing the danger of using uninspected meat have prohibited the importation of such; our federal government has admitted the possibility of such danger by providing inspection for all our meats intended for export to those provinces.

There is perhaps no part of the dominion which can as ill afford to ignore the ordinary precautions against disease as Prince Edward Island. Naturally our province is exceptionally healthy, but we are a small community, isolated and outside of the world currents which tend to a constantly changing population.

It will be remembered that Dr. Koch, in 1903, startled and mystified the medical world by announcing that bovine and human tuberculosis were entirely different and not intercommunicable.

The inference is clear and indisputable. We know that there are many tuberculous animals in the herds of this province; we know that the milk or meat of such animals will carry the seeds of disease to our homes.

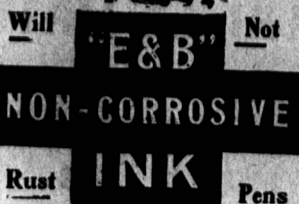
