The Senate went on record against woman suffrage by a vote of 17 to 14 after a spirited debate. The galleries were crowded with women. The resolution urging a senatorial direct vote amendment was lost by a vote of 18 to 14.

He had been in poor health for several years. Mr. McSweeney was held in high esteem as he was one of Moncton's leading and best known citizens, widely known to the travelling public having been proprietor of the Brunswick about twenty-five years, and he had a very large circle of strong personal friends who will hear with deep regret of his death. He was fifty-four years old and is survived by a widow, i. e., Miss Lefurgy, of Summerside, daughter of the late Hon. John Lefurgy of Summerside, and a sister of A. A. Lefurgy, ex-M. P., of Summerside. One son and one daughter, one brother, and five sisters survive. His wife, son and daughter were at his bedside when he passed away.

**BIG ROOM FOR JOGGINS MINES.**  
 MONTREAL, March 22—The Maritime Coal, Railroad and Power Co., of which Hon. William Mitchell is President, and which was largely promoted some years ago by H. Legan, ex-M. P. for Cumberland, have selected English capital to the extent of a million dollars, and a general development will take place at the Joggin's Mines during the summer, although the output is now about 700 tons a day.

The annual meeting will be held here tomorrow, and it is said that Senator Mitchell is desirous of retiring from the presidency, his place to be taken by William Hanson.

**YOUTH IN NEW YORK WROTE "BLACK HAND LETTER"**

NEW YORK, March 23—A diminutive enulator of "Black Hand" methods came to grief yesterday, traced by a letter he had written, and which had struck terror to the wealthy family receiving it. The story came out when Isador Ginsburg, 11 years old, was arrested, charged with penning a threatening "missive to Harry and Mrs. Blecker on Avenue A."  
 "Don't tell the police," the letter read, "or for you sure death, my dear sir. Give us 500 bucks or we will kill you and Mrs. Blecker. We will kidnap your son. Put 500 dollars in the cellar of no 247 East Tenth Street, or if not we will murder you by Monday night. Quiet or your son will be ours."  
 The letter was signed "Black Hand Gang." The boy when arrested declared he and a school mate whose name he did not remember were promised ten cents by an unknown man, if they would write the letter he dictated.

**C. P. R. PROPOSED ROUTE THROUGH BELLEVILLE.**

BELLEVILLE, March 23—The Canadian Pacific Railway's revised map and book of reference of the route through Belleville was received by the City Clerk. It shows that the new line will run parallel to and north of the recently-constructed Canadian Northern Ontario, line along the waterfront. The map approves of a revision of the route in West Belleville and Sidney township, where it requires possession of the right of way and tracks of the C. N. O. Railway, in exchange for which the C. P. R. proposes to construct a line somewhat to the south of the present location for the C. N. O. Railway. This means that the latter line will be shoved closer to the waterfront for the purpose of obviating two grade crossings within a space of less than four miles. By this the C. P. R. steps in between the city and the C. N. O. Railway.

**WILLIAM JAMES TRAVELLER DEAD.**
