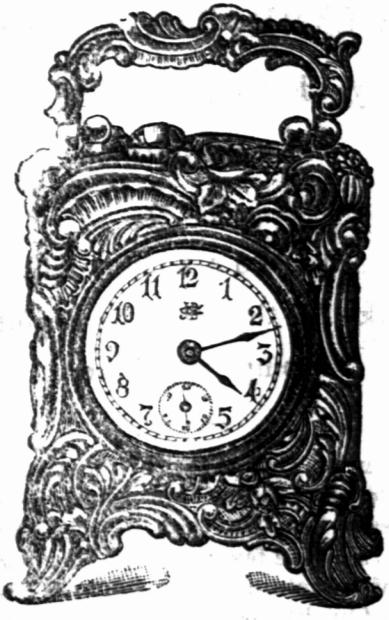

THE following additional particulars regarding the late George E. MacMillan have been forwarded to us by one of his college friends. Never in the history of the present student generation has the death of any undergraduate cast such genuine sorrow among so many students. He was a young man of a loveable disposition, and deep convictions on all vital questions, and lived up to his convictions with that manly courage which always wins the respect and confidence of men. His course in College was a highly creditable one, and he was looked upon as the strongest man in his year. From the very first he identified himself closely with all that affects the undergraduate life. His great interest was the work of the Young Men's Christian Association of the University, and in no place did his earnest Christian character exert a more powerful influence. It was an understood thing among the leaders of the Association, that next year he would be president—the most influential office any student can hold. Although his death was only known in the afternoon, a large number of students assembled at the Station to express their sympathy with the Father, and to show their respect for his son. Principle Peterson only heard the sad news a few minutes before the train left with the body and he hastened to show his sympathy with the bereaved family. On Sunday afternoon next a Memorial Service will be held in the University at which the lessons of his life will be dwelt upon.

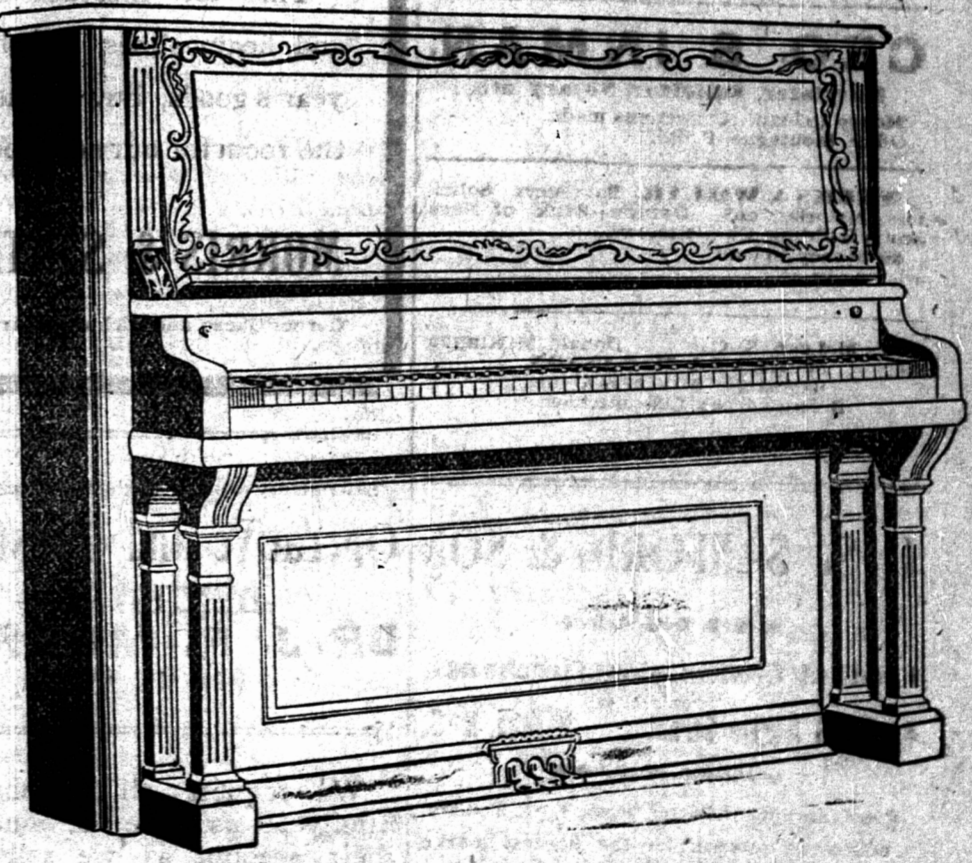
