Premier Matheson and Mrs. Matheson, Charlottetown, spent the week end in Georgetown.

Premier and Mrs. Matheson, Charlottetown, were passengers to Georgetown on Saturday afternoon.

The C. G. S. Constance arrived in Charlottetown about two p. m. Saturday and docked at the Marine Wharf.

The firemen were called out at 11.40 Saturday morning for a fire at Mr. Fennell's, Euston Street. There was slight damage done.

C. P. and Mrs. Larned of Detroit, arrived in the city Friday night and registered at the Victoria Hotel. They left Saturday for their summer residence in Keppock.

E. L. Goodwill, barrister-at-law, Peterboro, Ont., and Mrs. Goodwill, have left Montreal on the Cascapedia for Charlottetown to spend a vacation with Mrs. Goodwill of Brighton.

The Trinity Term of the Supreme Court will open in Charlottetown tomorrow. There are two criminal cases on the docket previously referred to. There will be about five jury cases and as many non-jury cases. There are suits brought by John Dalziel, administrator of the late Arthur Dalziel, killed during the building of Zion Church, against contractor Clark, and the Messrs. Rice, who were employed on the work.

At a special meeting of the City Council in Charlottetown Friday evening plans were discussed for the reception to the Governor General on his visit here next month. The Mayor and Council, were appointed a committee to deal with the matter. Saturday morning a committee consisting of Mayor Lyons, and Councilors Ribley, McLaughlan and McKenna waited on Premier Matheson, to discuss co-operation between the Provincial and Civic Governments. The committee is to report at the special meeting of the Council tonight.

The annual meeting of the Queens Co. District Lodge, I.O.G.T., was held on Thursday afternoon, the 20th inst, in Hertz Hall, East Royalty, A. D. Fraser, Grand Sec'y, presiding. All the officers and standing committees were re-elected for the ensuing year. Favorable reports were heard from the subordinate lodges, and fifteen new members took the District Degree. The I. O. G. T. now has 279 members in Queens Co. A public meeting was held in the evening, at which the hall was crowded and a very interesting programme was carried out.

On Saturday one of Charlottetown's shippers supplied The Guardian with a few interesting facts concerning the St. John's, Newfoundland, market. A part of his letter read as follows—"It might interest your people to know that the wholesale men of St. John's are now getting fresh beef from the Argentine. Australian butter is quite common here and German oats will be on the market very soon, sample of which we enclose." A clipping from St. John's Herald reads as follows: "The venture of Messrs. Campbell & McKay in bringing fresh meat here all the way from the Argentine, and mutton from New Zealand deserved success. The quality of the meat is excellent and is in splendid condition. Moreover it can be sold at less than the scrub imported from the Maritime Provinces and Ontario. This may settle the meat problem for St. John's. To the poor, fresh meat has been an unattainable article recently and even the well to do, must pay 25 and 30 cents per lb, for beef and mutton that is not first quality. But we think that some Cold Storage facilities during the summer months will be necessary to handle it with success. The dealer who supplied The Guardian with above facts, claims that it is only a matter of time, before Newfoundland will import or handle very little produce from Prince Edward Island. The reason for this change is on account of the poor quality of beef shipped, and the exceedingly high prices food stuffs are at present selling for on the home market.
