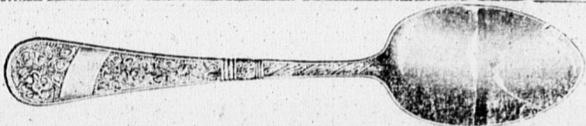

BRITAIN ADVISES CHINA TO ARBITRATE

PEKIN, Jan. 8.—Because of Great Britain's position as Portugal's protector, Sir John G. Jordan, British minister to China, yesterday in a friendly capacity, counselled the Foreign Board that China adopt arbitration as the best means to a solution of the Macao boundary dispute. While China, in a despatch sent last Sunday, notified the Portuguese Government that it would not submit the matter to The Hague, it did not close the way to arbitration by some other court.
