MORE YOUNG FOXES.—The Dennis Ranch at Royalty has been favored with a litter of young foxes. Mr. Dennis informed a Guardian representative on Saturday that all his pairs, with the possible exception of one, will have litters this season.

INQUIRIES FOR FOXES.—The Canadian Fox Exchange, Messrs McKinnon and Newson, Managers, have disposed of all the options on 1913 foxes held by them. They now have several inquiries from abroad and want several pairs of high grade black foxes. When writing state pedigree fully.

DEATH IN NEW YORK.—There died at Fordham Hospital, New York City, on March 16th, 1913, Roderick A. McDonald, aged 45 years. The late Mr. McDonald was a son of Mr. Ronald McDonald of Cherry Valley. He was a quiet, unassuming man, much respected by all who knew him. He leaves a widow and three sons.

FUNERAL SATURDAY.—The funeral of the late Mr. James Callaghan took place from his son's residence, Bayfield Street, on Saturday morning to St. Dunstan's Pro-Cathedral, where a Requiem Mass was celebrated by Father Pius MacDonal. Interment was made in the Catholic Cemetery where Father Maurice McDonald officiated at the final service.

PAROLE OFFICER.—Mr. Archibald, Dominion parole officer, passed through Moncton Friday for Dorchester, where he will inspect the maritime penitentiary. The system, Mr. Archibald says, has achieved some wonderful results since it was first established fourteen years ago. During that time there had been released 4,579 prisoners. Of these returned to their vicious methods of life. Through other causes than that of crime 107 had forfeited their parole.—Mr. Archibald has visited Charlottetown on several occasions.

ANOTHER LOCATED.—The Amherst News, referring to the arrest in Moncton of a man giving his name as Murphy, and having a number of begging cards on his person, says Murphy is well known in Amherst. He has been in jail here four times since last November. He was arrested last week and was allowed to get out of town. His arrest in Moncton followed for the same game that he practised in Amherst. Murphy belongs to Charlottetown and is a big, able, healthy man. If he returns to Amherst there will be a more serious charge brought against him.

MAGDALEN ISLANDS TRAFFIC.—The steamer Lady Sybil has been hauled up on the marine slip at Dartmouth for some extensive repairs to her bottom plates, in which some new steel plates will be inserted. During the summer and autumn the Lady Sybil conducts a subsidized passenger and freight service between the Nova Scotian north shore and the Magdalen Islands. She has been laid up on the waterfront since navigation closed, but will proceed round to the gulf to resume her route in another fortnight.—Halifax exchange. The Sybil is well known in this port.
