## Capture Seven Bouts Of Ten Scheduled; Lose One To Visitors

Charlottetown's amateur boxing team stroked their winning streak to three straight in inter-city competition when they were returned the winners in seven of the eight inter-city bouts against Springhill staged at the Sporting Club last night. The local fighting team scored two knockouts and were awarded the judges' decision in five other bouts to register a decisive victory while the Springhill team gained their only win when Kid Smith took a decision over young Benny Blinn in the second bout on the card.

The fighters took their cue from the preliminary between Kid Reid and Bobo Mills which quickly resolved into a slug-fest as the fighters squared off and carried right through to the main event providing action all the way, the only delay in the proceedings coming when the Poulton-Blinn Hayden bout was declared a "no contest" by the referee.

**Main Event**

The main event between Allie Fraser, 166 of Springhill who entered the ring with a string of consecutive victories and Lloyd Martin, 158, proved to be just that as the boys started a rugged battle in three action-filled rounds that had the crowd shouting their encouragement as Martin's punches were deflected by Fraser's guard. The Springhill fighter started off with a rush and for a while it looked as though Martin would be no. 13 on his list of wins but he weathered the storm wisely saving himself for the next two rounds. Martin took the offensive at the start of the second round and slugged it out toe-to-toe with his taller opponent and as the round ended had Fraser groggy in his own camp and was punching him at will. The fighters entered the last round on even terms but Martin's punches were more staying power and was awarded a close decision. Both fighters took only a minute and a half to get ready for the next round.

**Wins Close Decision**

The West End's Frankie Gormley had a tough time winning the third inter-city bout with one judge calling it a draw and the other giving it to Gormley. Gormley, weighed 137 and Newcombe 135.

Kid Smith, 124½, was the only Springhill fighter to win his bout as he made "he most of his longer repeated" with a straight left preventing the shorter Springhill fighter from getting in close and had the claret running freely from his nose as the bout ended.

George Peterson (aged the North End "Wildcat", Joe McLeod in a mild preliminary while Bobo Mills declared Kid Reid in a wild slug-fest affair in the second all-city bout on the program.

A pair of paperweights performed in the curtain raiser with young Kennedy taking the decision over McCulligan in a smart performance for a pair of youngsters.

The officials were: E. F. Acorn, Judges—Jack Cameron, Jack Connelly, and Referee—Gus Longmeyer.

Art Jardine, former lightweight champion taking the decision was in charge of the Springhill team.
