**HEAT AND HEALTH.**

No country on earth has a greater natural store of coal than the United States and yet in no country has there been greater suffering during the current winter for want of fuel. The scarcity has been wholly due to the fact that all the principal mines and the railways connecting with them are in the control of huge trusts which have attempted to squeeze the largest amount of labor from their employees for the least amount of money and at the same time to extort from the consumer the highest price that the latter will pay for coal. The result was the prolonged strike among the miners in Pennsylvania, the practical shutting down of many mines, and a general coal famine in the cities of the land with great suffering and largely increased mortality.

All the cities of the Republic have suffered and especially those in the colder northern half of the country. Last week's bulletin of the Chicago Health department asserted that fully 10 per cent of the population—that is, 200,000 out of 2,000,000—are suffering seriously from ailments caused by privation and exposure, the result of the coal scarcity. The health bulletin states with emphasis that "those responsible for such a condition are guilty of constructive homicide for every resulting death." And

many deaths, thousands in the aggregate, have resulted. Especially has the death rate increased among the aged and the infantile classes. The period of coal scarcity was marked by an increase of 20 per cent among children under five years of age and an increase of 24 per cent among those over 60 years of age. In the final reckoning the coal barons will have blood-guiltiness to answer for if they do not amend their doings.

**WINTER SERVICE MEETING.**

The attention of all citizens interested in the service of the winter steamers and the mail service is directed to the public meeting to be held this afternoon in the Legislative Council Chamber to discuss those important matters. The meeting is called by the Board of Trade in order to confer with Mr. Armstrong, of the railway mail service, who has arrived from Ottawa to look into the grievances complained of. It is most desirable that there shall be a large attendance and a full and free expression of the public feeling in regard to the matters at issue.

Let all resolve to attend, enjoy a splendid treat, get more than their money's worth and at the same time contribute to a most deserving object.

One of the best temperance meetings in many years was that of Friday evening, the report of which appeared in our issue of Saturday. Capital addresses were delivered by the clergymen and laymen alike who took part. While it is expected of our gospel ministers that they shall aid in the work of moral reform, a judicious zeal and untiring energy in promotion of the good work has been displayed by a number of our city ministers which is beyond all praise. We cheerfully admit that of late much of this praise is due to our political contemporaries—The Patriot and The Examiner. The parties they represent are divided in opinion on the prohibition question and it is therefore the more praiseworthy that their newspaper organs are lending their support to the prohibitory law as they are now doing.
