Into the soundless world in which she has lived since her birth the sweet, high notes of a song penetrated and Helen Keller, for the first time in her life, actually heard sound. Hitherto she has "heard" through her sensitive fingers, which she placed on the lips and throat of the person whose words she wished to read. This time the beautiful high notes of a selection from "Die Walkure," sung by Mme. Saltzman-Stevens of the Chicago Grand Opera Company, reached the girl's brain through her ears. With uplifted hands and heaving bosom she exclaimed over and over at the completion of the song: "Oh, I have heard! I have heard! I could weep for joy!"
