OTTAWA, Aug. 1.—(CP)—Here is a list of the consumer goods affected by the repeal of excise tax: Saturday night: Grills, waffle irons, hot plates, roasters, kettles, chafing dishes, food or drink mixers, juicer extractors, coffee makers, toasters of all kinds, portable humidifiers, curling irons or tongs, hair dryers, permanent waving machines, razors, and shavers, food choppers and grinders, irons and ironers, vacuum cleaners and attachments, garbage disposal units, floor waxers and polishers.

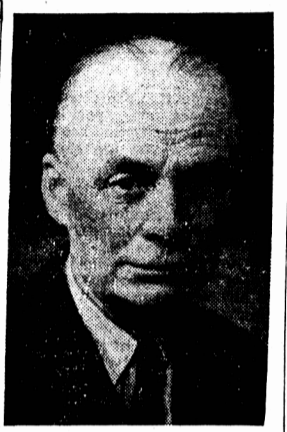
